Ecclesiastes reminds us of God's perfect timing—even when human authorities wrestle with decisions. Meanwhile, Psalm 82 calls for justice on behalf of the oppressed, highlighting what God's justice demands.

We all face times when truth is challenged by convenience, fear, or power struggles. Pilate's hesitation warns us about the cost of avoiding hard truths. Jesus' trial compels us to consider how we seek and stand for truth — especially when it's unpopular or difficult.

Reflect on how you respond when truth is questioned or pressured. Are you willing to stand firm, even if it means discomfort or opposition?

When pressure mounts, our natural instinct may be to fear or flee, but Jesus models a higher way: standing firm with conviction. This courage does not dismiss real dangers but trusts God's protection and plan.

Ask yourself today how you can lean on God's spirit to face your challenges boldly and faithfully.

Paul teaches that Jesus took on the sin He never committed, becoming sin for us so we might be made right with God. Hebrews affirms the sufficiency of Christ's one sacrifice.

This profound love calls us into awe, gratitude, and repentance as we receive the gift of salvation.

Reflect today on the weight Jesus carried on your behalf and respond with worship.
