Day 2: V Jesus Blesses the Little Ones

Devotional: Receiving and Sharing God's Blessing

Devotional: Embracing Childlike Faith for Salvation

Jesus challenges us to adopt the faith qualities of children to enter His kingdom. Childlike faith is characterized by trust, humility, and openness—not childishness or ignorance. It means depending fully on God, without doubt or pride, and accepting His grace with gratitude.

Devotional: Answering God's Call to Protect Children
