Devotional: Jesus: The Seed Who Defeats Evil

Genesis 3:15 is known as the *protoevangelium*, the first gospel promise, where God foretells the coming of a Savior who will defeat evil. This promise points directly to Jesus as the seed of the woman who will crush the serpent's head, symbolizing His ultimate victory over Satan and sin.

Jesus is the fulfillment of this ancient prophecy. His life, death, and resurrection accomplished what was first hinted at in Genesis: the restoration of the broken relationship between God and humanity. Even the earliest chapters of Scripture anticipate Christ's redeeming work.

Reflecting on this, we see that Jesus is not an afterthought or simply confined to the New Testament. From the beginning, God's plan centered on Christ—the one who would bring salvation to the fallen world.

When John the Baptist declares Jesus as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29), he connects directly the Exodus imagery to Christ's sacrificial mission. The Exodus events were a shadow of the greater deliverance Jesus provides — freedom from sin and spiritual bondage.

Recognizing Jesus in Exodus helps us appreciate the depth of God's salvation plan. The story isn't just history — it's prophecy fulfilled in Christ's redeeming work on the cross.




