Through careful reflection of Scripture, prayer, and journaling, this week-long study will equip you to embrace God's perspective and find grace whether you are in a marriage, seeking one, or walking through the challenges of relational brokenness. May this study inspire confidence in God's plan for love, commitment, and restoration.

















Your Verse

Matthew 19:4-6 - 'Haven't you read,' he replied, 'that at the beginning the Creator made them male and female... Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Genesis 2:24 'That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh.'
- Ephesians 5:31 "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."







Devotional: Understanding God's Original Marriage Plan

Marriage is more than a contract—it's divine intention. Jesus points us back to the very beginning, to God's design in creation. Notice how He refers to Genesis, showing that marriage is foundational and sacred. The union of one man and one woman is a picture of unity, intimacy, and permanence.

This divine design underscores the commitment expected in a marriage covenant. It's about leaving previous attachments, cleaving to one's spouse, and becoming 'one flesh.' This foreshadows not only physical connection but spiritual and emotional unity.

Reflect on how this understanding impacts your view of marriage. It is God who initiates marriage, and He desires it to reflect His faithfulness toward us. Do we value marriage as a covenant that mirrors God's unwavering love? Today, invite God to reveal how His design invites us into deeper commitment and unity.

Your Verse

Matthew 19:7-8 - 'Why then,' they asked, 'did Moses command that a man give his wife a certificate of divorce and send her away?' Jesus replied, 'Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because your hearts were hard.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 24:1 'If a man marries a woman who becomes displeasing to him because he finds something indecent about her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce...'
- Malachi 2:16 'I hate divorce,' says the LORD God of Israel...







Day 2: V Addressing Human Brokenness: Divorce

Devotional: God's Compassion Amidst Brokenness

Divorce is a reality caused by hardened hearts. Jesus acknowledges the pain and brokenness that divorce highlights. While God's design is for lasting marriage, human sin has led to fractured relationships.

When questioned about the Mosaic law permitting divorce, Jesus points out this accommodation was due to the hardness of human hearts, not God's perfect will. This truth reminds us that *God is both holy and compassionate*—He hates divorce but also understands human weakness.

In moments of brokenness, God invites us to bring our hurts to Him. He offers restoration, healing, and hope beyond failure. Today, if you or someone you know has experienced divorce or relational pain, rest in the compassionate heart of God who longs to redeem and restore.

Your Verse

Matthew 19:9 - 'I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another woman commits adultery.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Malachi 2:14 'The LORD is acting as the witness between you and the wife of your youth, because you have broken faith with her...'
- Hebrews 13:4 'Let marriage be held in honor among all... and the marriage bed kept pure...'







Day 3: The Covenant Commitment

Devotional: Understanding the Seriousness of Covenant

Marriage is a solemn covenant requiring faithfulness. Jesus' words highlight the sanctity of the marriage union and caution against breaking this covenant except in cases of sexual immorality.

This teaching reveals God's high regard for marital fidelity and *the* consequences when the covenant is broken. It calls for honesty, purity, and enduring commitment.

Reflect on what this means personally. The covenant is not simply a legal agreement but a spiritual bond witnessed by God. Faithfulness in marriage is a reflection of our faithfulness to God Himself.

Devotional: Embracing God's Grace in All Circumstances

Jesus acknowledges different callings and challenges within relationships. Not everyone is called to marriage, and some choose singleness or sacrifice for the kingdom's sake.

This passage invites us to embrace God's grace regardless of our marital status. Whether married, single, divorced, or widowed, God's restoration and purpose remain available.

God's Spirit brings freedom and healing to those weighed down by relational brokenness or unmet expectations. Trusting His grace enables us to find hope, purpose, and joy in every season of life.

Your Verse

- Ephesians 4:32 'Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.'
- Psalm 147:3 'He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.'







Day 5: Confidence of Forgiveness and Healing

Devotional: The Power of Forgiveness in Relationships

Forgiveness is essential for healing relationships. Whether in marriage or after divorce, God calls us to forgive as He forgave us. This doesn't minimize pain but opens the door to restoration and peace.

Holding onto bitterness only deepens wounds and hinders God's healing work. Forgiveness frees the heart and reflects God's mercy to those around us.

Devotional: Hope in God's Restorative Power

God promises restoration even after loss and brokenness. Like promises in Joel and Jeremiah, God can restore what has been lost, healing wounds of the heart and giving new life.

Whatever struggles or relational failures you face, God's restorative power is bigger than your pain. He is able to remake marriages, rebuild trust, and renew joy in His salvation.
