
Jesus, the Fulfillment of Isaiah's Prophecy


Join in with an open heart and mind as we explore the living Word—the One who fulfills prophecy and invites us into abundant life.

Luke 4:16-21 (NIV) - "He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him..."

Devotional: Jesus Declares His Mission from Isaiah

Luke 4:16–21 captures a landmark moment: Jesus intentionally reads Isaiah's scroll to introduce Himself as the promised Messiah. The synagogue attendees expect a teacher or prophet, but Jesus proclaims a mission that changes history.

In Isaiah's words, the anointing by the Spirit signals a divine commissioning. Jesus reads, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me," marking His authority to bring good news, freedom, and healing.

Jesus claims these words are fulfilled **here and now**, declaring that the long-awaited salvation has arrived in Him. This public reading is not just a recitation but a declaration: the prophecy and promise of hope meet reality in Jesus.

As we begin, consider your understanding of prophecy and fulfillment. God's promises are not static words but living truths revealed powerfully through Jesus. Be open to recognizing God's work in unexpected ways.



Day 2: W The Anointing by the Spirit

Devotional: Empowered by the Holy Spirit for Mission





Prayer for Today





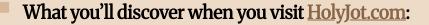




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
