Devotional: The Heart of Jesus: Compassionate Weeping

Devotional: Turning Back: Embracing God's Invitation

Throughout Scripture, God consistently invites His people to humble themselves and return to Him. 2 Chronicles 7:14 reminds us of the power of repentance—when God's people turn back to Him, He promises healing and restoration.

Devotional: Drawn by the Shepherd's Love

In Matthew 23:37, Jesus expresses His deep yearning to gather Jerusalem's children like a mother hen gathers her chicks. His longing is tender and persistent, symbolizing God's desire to protect, nurture, and bring His people close.

The imagery of the shepherd also reminds us of Jesus' role as our caring guide. Just like a shepherd watches over the flock with love and vigilance (Isaiah 40:11; John 10:14), Jesus seeks to gather and care for us personally.

Despite rejection, His desire never ceases. This divine yearning invites us to rest in His embrace and trust His leadership even amidst hardship. It also calls us to reflect His gathering love to others, welcoming them into God's family.

Devotional: Heeding God's Messengers

Throughout history, those who bring God's truth often face opposition and suffering (Hebrews 11). Jesus' own ministry reflects this pattern, and His final lament conveys the tragedy of missed opportunities for repentance.

Today, this calls us to examine our openness to God's voice. Are we receptive to correction, guidance, and challenge? Are we willing to follow God's messengers, even when it is uncomfortable? Jesus invites us to respond with faith, declaring joy in the coming of the Lord.
