Devotional: Answering God's Unexpected Call

Devotional: You Can't Hide from God's Reach

Jonah's attempt to escape God's plan is a powerful reminder that we cannot run from God. No matter where Jonah went, God's presence and purpose pursued him. Even the violent storm proved God was at work.

How often do we try to avoid difficult assignments or convicting truths? Yet, trying to hide from God's calling brings turmoil and unrest, depicted here by the raging sea and frightened sailors. God's sovereignty extends over creation; His plans will never be thwarted by human flight.

In your own life, consider areas where you might be resisting God's direction.

The storm may come — whether external circumstances or internal turmoil

— which indicates that God is working to bring you back on course.

Devotional: When Truth Surfaces in the Storm

In the midst of chaos, truth comes to light. The sailors' casting of lots and Jonah's confession showed how God uses hard circumstances to bring hidden realities into the open.

What truths is God revealing to you through difficult seasons? Jonah's honesty about his identity and fear of the Lord is a pivotal moment — a raw admission before God and men. Sometimes, God allows trials to expose the things we try to hide, not to condemn, but to bring clarity and transformation.

This truth can be uncomfortable, but it's necessary for growth. God is not looking to shame but to redeem. How can you embrace God's refining work in your life today?

Devotional: Obedience Through Surrender

True obedience often begins with surrender. Jonah admitted his guilt and told the sailors how to calm the sea — by throwing him overboard.

How does surrender shape obedience? Sometimes God's call requires giving up control, even when the consequences look difficult. Jonah's surrender saved the others and moved God's plan forward.

You may face moments when obedience demands sacrifice and trust in God's goodness despite uncertainty. What is holding you back from wholehearted surrender today? Remember, surrender doesn't signal defeat but trust in God's sovereign care.
