# Devotional: God's Comfort Empowers Us to Comfort Others

Paul begins his letter by highlighting God as the 'Father of compassion and the God of all comfort.' In the midst of his own sufferings, Paul reminds us that God's comfort is not just a balm for our pain but a powerful source that enables us to comfort others.

When we walk through difficult seasons, it's easy to feel isolated or overwhelmed. Yet Paul shows a beautiful cycle: God comforts us so that we can comfort others. Our hardships are not without purpose; they equip us for ministry and deepen our empathy.

# Day 2: Strength in Weakness









#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:7-10 NIV "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.'"

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."
- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."







#### Devotional: God's Power Is Perfected in Our Weakness

Paul openly shares his thorn in the flesh—a persistent weakness or trial that kept him humble—and reveals a profound truth about God's grace. Instead of delivering Paul from his thorn, God assures him that His grace is enough. Divine power is most evident when human strength fails.

This challenges our natural inclination to rely on self-sufficiency. It invites us to a daily surrender, recognizing that our limitations provide a canvas for God's power to be displayed.

Embracing our weaknesses does not mean defeat; rather, it opens the door for God's strength to transform us and work through us. Paul's declaration, "For when I am weak, then I am strong," redefines strength in the kingdom of God.

Reflect today on where you feel weak or inadequate. Trust that God's grace will be your sufficiency and that in your vulnerability, His power will shine brightest.

# Devotional: Called to Be Ambassadors of God's Reconciliation

#### Devotional: Embracing Our Identity as New Creations


## **Prayer for Today**
