Devotional: Begin with God's Guidance in Leadership

David's anointing marks a pivotal turning point in Israel's history. Although he was already chosen by God in 1 Samuel, 2 Samuel 2 opens with David seeking God's direction as he begins to establish his reign over Judah. This demonstrates his humility and dependence on God from the very start.

David did not assume power for himself; he inquired of the LORD, showing a heart submitted to divine authority. For us today, this is a profound example of leadership grounded in God's guidance. Before making major decisions, David modeled reliance on God's wisdom.

Reflect on the fact that despite successes and anointing, David remained connected to God as his Shepherd (Psalm 23), trusting Him to lead each step. We are called to do the same — to seek God's direction continually and walk in obedience.






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
