Devotional: Receiving Power to Witness Boldly

Day 3: Peter's Bold Proclamation

Acts 2:14–22 – Peter addresses the crowd, explaining Pentecost as fulfillment of prophecy and testifying to Jesus' resurrection.

- Acts 2:36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."
- Isaiah 53:5 "By his wounds we are healed."







Day 3: Peter's Bold Proclamation

Devotional: God's Power Confirming the Gospel

The early church's witness was accompanied by miraculous signs that confirmed the truth of the gospel. Healing the sick and casting out evil spirits showed that the kingdom of God had arrived through Jesus and His followers.

These acts of power drew attention and led many to faith, validating the apostles' message in a skeptical culture. However, the greatest miracle was changed lives — hearts transformed by grace and truth.

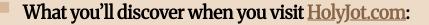




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
