Think about the significance of God choosing to reveal Himself not through an idea or distant voice but through a person, Jesus, who lived a tangible life. This means that faith is not based solely on abstract truths but on a living relationship with Christ. The glory described here—the glory of the one and only Son, full of grace and truth—invites us to encounter Jesus personally and experience transformation.

As we begin this study, let your heart open to the profound mystery of the incarnation. Consider how this truth impacts your faith—does it inspire awe, deepen trust, or challenge your understanding? The Word made flesh is the ultimate revelation of God's love and the cornerstone of our hope.

Furthermore, John identifies Jesus as the promised Messiah, fulfilling long-anticipated prophecies, which shows the continuity of God's plan through history.

As you meditate on this passage, ask yourself whether your life reflects a similar clarity and humility in pointing others to Jesus. Consider how boldly you proclaim Him as Savior. Let John's example inspire you to be a faithful witness, ready to share the hope found in the Lamb of God.



#### Devotional: Responding to Jesus' Invitation

The response of the disciples —to follow Jesus and discover where He leads—demonstrates faith in action.

Notice how these men and women recognize something unique about Jesus immediately. They address Him as Rabbi and witness to His identity as Messiah, the Son of God. This passage shows that following Jesus begins with curiosity and openness to knowing Him deeply.

Reflect on what it means for you to respond to Jesus' invitation today. Are you willing to step out in faith, engage personally with Him, and allow Him to reveal His purpose for your life? Following Christ is a journey of discovery and growth that starts with a simple yes.

Nicodemus, a Pharisee and teacher of Israel, comes to Jesus by night in John 3:1–21, seeking understanding. Jesus tells him a radical truth: "You must be born again" to see the Kingdom of God. This spiritual rebirth points to the transformative power of God's grace beyond physical lineage or religious status.

The passage also contains one of the most beloved verses, John 3:16, affirming God's love demonstrated through Jesus' sacrifice. Jesus explains that eternal life comes through belief in Him, highlighting faith as central to salvation.

Consider your own journey of spiritual new birth. What areas of your heart need transforming? The conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus encourages believers to pursue a fresh start grounded in God's love and truth. It reminds us that eternal life begins with a personal, living faith.

Their conversation reveals Jesus' knowledge of her past and His offer of forgiveness and new life. The woman's testimony leads many in her town to believe in Him, showing the power of personal encounter and witness.

This passage challenges us to seek Jesus as the source of true satisfaction and to share our encounters with others boldly. No past mistakes or societal barriers block God's grace. Consider how you receive and offer living water in your own life.

Consider the power of faith expressed by the official and how your trust in Jesus shapes your own life's difficult moments. Sometimes faith means believing before seeing, embracing the hope found only in Christ's promises.

This teaching invites us to truly receive Christ—to believe, partake, and abide in Him. Jesus' call to "eat" His flesh and "drink" His blood—symbolic of intimate union—may be difficult to understand but points to total reliance on Him for life and salvation.

Ask yourself how deeply you depend on Jesus daily. Is He your source of strength, hope, and purpose? Consider ways to cultivate an ongoing hunger for Christ that surpasses physical needs and leads to eternal life.
