Devotional: Guarding Against Greed: Judas's Lesson

When Judas agreed to betray Jesus for thirty pieces of silver, the connection between his love of money and his ultimate act of betrayal became tragically clear. The Bible also tells us that Satan entered Judas, showing how evil influenced his choices at a critical point.

What about your heart regarding money, possessions, or control? Judas's example warns that material desire can poison relationships with God and others. Guard against greed becoming a foothold for darker temptations. Ask God to purify your heart and align it with His kingdom values.

After realizing the enormity of his betrayal, Judas was overwhelmed by guilt and remorse. Yet, unlike Peter, who repented and was restored, Judas fell into despair, ending his life tragically.

His story reveals the devastating effects of unaddressed sin and hopelessness. Godly sorrow, as Paul explains, leads to repentance and restoration, but Judas's sorrow became toxic regret that separated him from God.

We must learn from this sobering example: no sin is too great for God's forgiveness, but the door to restoration remains open only if we turn to Him with a repentant heart.
