The faith of the friends who brought the man reflects the community's role in salvation and healing. Jesus challenges the religious leaders' skepticism, showing His authority to forgive and heal.

This account invites us to seek Jesus not only for physical needs but for spiritual renewal, trusting in His power to restore whole lives.

Day 14: Feeding the 5000

#### Devotional: Jesus Fulfills Our Deepest Needs

The miraculous feeding of the 5000 shows Jesus' compassion and power to provide abundantly. In a place of scarcity, He multiplies little to meet the needs of many.
