#### Introduction

This 21-day Bible study plan is designed to bring you hope, encouragement, and practical spiritual insights rooted in God's Word. This plan is crafted to verse your mind in Scripture about recovery, freedom, and healing. Each day's devotional includes a primary scripture passage, supporting verses, insightful reflections, and guided questions to help you process your experience in light of God's truth. The journaling prompts enable you to apply lessons personally and track your growth. Finally, daily prayers uplift your spirit and invite God's presence to walk with you.

Remember, recovery is a step-by-step journey—never rushed, always rooted in God's timing and grace. Whether you feel small incremental changes or







profound breakthroughs, God is faithful to lead you into wholeness. Let this time be a sacred pause of renewing your mind, grounding your identity in Christ, and embracing the freedom He offers.

We pray this study encourages you to lean into God's gentle strength, break chains of compulsive thoughts and behaviors, and celebrate each victory—no matter how small—as a testament to His healing power. Start today with courage; God walks beside you every step.









## Day 1: V Strength in Weakness









Day 1: **(**) Strength in Weakness

#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: **(**) Strength in Weakness

#### Devotional: God's Power Perfects Your Weakness

Beginning your recovery journey may feel daunting, especially when facing personal weaknesses. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians remind us that God's grace isn't just enough—it is perfect when we are at our weakest. Your obsessive compulsive behaviors might make you feel powerless or ashamed, but God's power shines brightest in those places. When you acknowledge your weakness, you open a doorway for Christ's strength to work within you.

This strength isn't about immediately conquering everything or being perfect instantly. It's about knowing you don't walk alone in your battle or struggle. God promises to be close to you, especially when your heart feels crushed or overwhelmed by repetitive thoughts or compulsions (Psalm 34:18). Feel the Father's nearness and courage today.

Remember not to fear the process or your setbacks. God's presence is constant and unwavering. His grace cushions the hard moments and resets your courage for each step forward. Take comfort that your journey isn't defined by what you can't do yet, but by God's ongoing work in your life. Let His power rest upon you as you lean into Him.

Romans 12:2 - "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 4:8 "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble...think about such things."
- Colossians 3:2 "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things."







#### Devotional: Renew Your Mind for Lasting Change

Obsessive compulsive thoughts often feel like a relentless cycle in the mind.

Paul's exhortation in Romans reminds us that healing begins with a transformed mind. Recovery means intentionally changing how we think, moving away from harmful patterns and allowing God's truth to renew our thoughts and perspectives.

Renewing your mind doesn't happen overnight and may require persistent effort. It involves planting your focus on God's good and perfect will, meditating on truth, peace, and purity as described in Philippians 4:8. Replacing destructive thoughts with God-honoring ones helps weaken compulsive loops.

Begin today by identifying obsessive thoughts and gently redirecting them to Scripture and prayer. Set your mind on higher things (Colossians 3:2), cultivating a mental environment where freedom and hope can grow. Remember, God equips you with His Spirit to guide this transformation daily.

Break the cycle of compulsive thinking and fill my mind with Your peace. Strengthen me to follow Your good and perfect will daily. In Jesus' name, Amen.

















#### Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

#### Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







#### Devotional: Receive God's Peace in Anxiety

Anxiety often accompanies obsessive compulsive behaviors, creating inner turmoil. Paul instructs us not to be anxious but to bring every concern to God through prayer. This act of turning our worries over to God invites His supernatural peace to settle in our hearts and minds—a peace beyond human understanding.

Experience God's gift of peace today by intentionally pausing your habits and replacing worry with prayer and thanksgiving. Like Jesus promised in John 14:27, His peace is different from anything the world offers: steady, lasting, and deeply renewing.

Practice trusting God's sovereignty over your thoughts and compulsions.

Isaiah assures us that steadfast trust holds the key to perfect peace. When you feel overwhelmed, fix your mind on God's unchanging nature and letting Him guard your heart. Peace is not an escape from struggle but a powerful presence that sustains you through it.

Day 4: A Freedom in Christ

#### Devotional: Stand Firm in Your Freedom

Being trapped by obsessive compulsive behaviors can feel like a prison. But Scripture declares a powerful truth: Christ has set you free from slavery to sin, fear, and bondage. This freedom is not merely a future promise but a present reality to claim and stand firm upon.

Often, our minds and hearts can unconsciously return to old ways, tempting us to re-enter captivity. Paul's message in Galatians urges us not to be burdened again or entangled by the chains of compulsive struggles. Freedom in Christ requires active commitment, daily surrender, and reminding ourselves who we are in Him.

**Today, declare your freedom boldly.** Jesus offers liberation that breaks every chain (John 8:36). The Spirit empowers you to walk in newness of life, no longer controlled by compulsions or doubt. Embrace this fresh start and act in faith to overcome the yoke holding you down.

Day 6: 6 God's Refining Fire

### Devotional: God Shapes You Through Hardship

Recovery often involves enduring seasons of affliction and testing. Isaiah reveals that God uses difficult times as a refining process, purifying His children like silver in a furnace. Your struggle with obsessive compulsive behaviors can feel like such a furnace, but it's not without purpose.

These trials produce perseverance, faith, and character as described in 1 Peter. God is not abandoning you; He is carefully shaping and strengthening you through the fire. This refining is painful but essential to becoming more like Christ.

**Today, view your challenges as God's refining work.** Trust that He is faithful to bring you through and leave you stronger, purer, and more resilient. His refining will lead to greater freedom and peace.

### Devotional: Community Strengthens Your Recovery

In recovery, support and community are vital. God calls us to carry each other's burdens, sharing in struggles rather than facing them alone. The feelings of isolation that OCD can foster often worsen symptoms, but connection brings strength and hope.

This mutual bearing of burdens fulfills Jesus' law of love. Walking the journey alongside trusted friends, family, or faith communities allows for encouragement, accountability, and empathy. Two are stronger than one; companionship can provide help when you stumble, as Solomon observes.

Today, consider who you can reach out to for help or whom you can encourage in their battles. Recovery flourishes in community and shared compassion.

**Trust is a daily choice, especially in times of fear or uncertainty.** Psalm 56 encourages placing confidence in God precisely when fear threatens. With trust comes blessing (Jeremiah 17:7), peace, and guidance.

Today, offer your compulsive urges, anxieties, and attempts at control to God. Submit your path to Him and receive His direction. Let go and lean into His faithful care, trusting He will lead you into freedom.

Create space today to receive that love deeply. While you wrestle with compulsive habits, remember God's love lavished upon you is powerful, redeeming, and constant (1 John 3:1). You are alive and cherished because of Jesus' great love demonstrated on the cross.

This love does not depend on your performance but offers freedom. When you embrace God's unconditional love, you begin to see yourself as He sees you: whole, valuable, and capable of transformation.
