Each day includes a Scripture passage, supporting verses, devotional insight, reflection questions, journaling prompts, and a prayer designed to uplift, encourage, and nurture your recovery journey. **Take your time, be gentle with yourself, and know that God's love enfolds you as you step toward new life and freedom in Him.**

May this study be a balm to your soul and a beacon of hope as you experience God's redeeming love afresh each day.

Devotional: Start Healing by Accepting God's Fresh Mercy

God's mercy is the foundation of recovery. When we carry the weight of past decisions, especially around abortion, it can feel overwhelming. Yet Scripture reminds us that God's compassion is renewed every morning and His love covers all our failures.

Your past does not define you. God's great love means He refuses to allow your mistakes to consume you. Rather, He invites you to a fresh start with His faithful mercy.

Understanding this mercy is critical to beginning your healing journey. It means God is not holding your past mistakes against you but extends grace far beyond what we can imagine. Today, accept His merciful embrace and let it soothe your pain.

Recovery starts by embracing that mercy, turning to God not with shame but with hope that He is making all things new.

Devotional: Allow God to Heal Your Deepest Wounds

God's promise to heal is personal and tender. He understands each ache, each sorrow, and yearns to restore your whole being. Healing does not erase pain instantly but invites a journey where wounds become pathways for God's grace.

Whatever you carry today, be encouraged that God is actively working to heal your heart. Trust Him to bring comfort in brokenness and hope in despair.

Forgiveness is not denying pain or pretending everything is okay. It's allowing God's justice and mercy to intersect in your life, cleansing your heart and breaking chains of shame.

Realize that forgiveness starts with confession—to God and, if needed, to yourself. Unlock your soul's captivity by accepting His purification and cleansing, remembering that His forgiveness is complete and freeing.

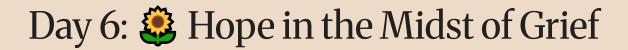
