A 21-day Bible study guiding survivors of abuse toward healing, hope, and restoration through Scripture and prayer.





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Introduction

Welcome to your journey of recovery and healing. Experiencing abuse—whether emotional, physical, or spiritual—can leave deep wounds and a sense of brokenness. Yet, *God's Word promises restoration, peace, and hope* to all who seek Him. This study is designed with love, compassion, and truth to support those recovering from abusive relationships.

Each day, you will engage with carefully chosen Scriptures that speak directly to your pain, your worth, and God's desire to heal you. You will find encouragement that **God sees your suffering**, hears your cries, and walks with you. As you read, reflect, and pray, you will begin to see how God's grace makes all things new.

Recovery is not a quick fix; it is a process. Through this 21-day plan, you will move step-by-step toward understanding your identity in Christ, finding strength to let go of fear and shame, and embracing God's promises for your future. Remember, *you are not alone*. The Lord is your refuge and your healer.

May this journey ignite hope in your heart and restore your soul. **Trust Him,** lean on Him, and allow His love to renew you fully.

Devotional: God Draws Near to the Brokenhearted

The pain caused by abuse can leave you feeling shattered and alone. But God's Word assures us that He is close to those who are brokenhearted and crushed in spirit. He is not distant or indifferent; He draws near to those who suffer wounds deep in their soul.

Today, take comfort in the presence of a God who sees your struggle and desires to heal you. Though your heart may feel heavy and tired, know that you are not carrying this burden alone. Jesus invites us to come to Him—to lay down our pain and receive His peace and rest.

Allow yourself to acknowledge your brokenness today, and bring it to the Lord in prayer. Your healing journey begins as you step into His loving embrace.

Devotional: Letting Go and Welcoming God's New Work

Abuse often leaves deep scars that anchor us to painful memories and regrets. Yet, God invites us to look forward with hope, not backward in despair. Through His grace, He is making all things new, including your life.

What would it look like to let go of the past today? To stop allowing those painful memories to define you? Isaiah encourages us to stop dwelling on what's been and to open our eyes to the new work God is doing.

This day marks a fresh start. Although scars remain, God's mercy and love are renewed every morning. Cling to the truth that you are made new in Christ and that your future is bright because it is held in His hands.

Devotional: Finding Safety Under God's Protective Shield

Recovery from abuse involves reclaiming your sense of safety and security. For many survivors, fear and anxiety are constant companions. But Scripture reassures us that God is our fortress and refuge—a mighty protector who shelters us from harm.

Imagine God as a solid rock you can lean on when the storms of life rage. In Him, you find strength, defense, and deliverance. You are not powerless or alone. No matter the threats or the memories that haunt you, God promises to stand against every attack.

Today, rest in His protection. Call on His name when fear creeps in, and let Him be your shield and stronghold. He is your safe place, and His love guards your heart.

Day 4: W Rediscovering Your Worth

Devotional: You Are God's Masterpiece, Never Forgotten

Abuse often chips away at one's sense of self-worth. Survivors may struggle with feelings of shame, rejection, and unworthiness. Yet God's Word reminds us that each person is fearfully and wonderfully made, deeply loved, and uniquely crafted by the Creator.

God's opinion matters most. You are His masterpiece, intentional and valuable beyond measure. The abuse you endured does not define you nor diminish your God-given dignity.

Today, begin to reclaim your identity as a beloved child of God. Let the truth of your worth sink deep into your heart and renew your spirit. You are treasured, chosen, and called for a beautiful purpose that no evil can erase.

Hold tightly to hope, for it is an anchor for your soul, steady and sure through every storm.

Devotional: God's Gentle Healing in Every Step

Healing from abuse is not instantaneous but requires patience and grace. God lovingly binds up our wounds and restores what has been broken in His perfect timing.

Allow yourself permission to heal one step at a time. There will be good days and hard days. God is present every moment, nurturing and knitting together your heart and spirit.

As you journey forward, lean into His care. Seek healing through prayer, Scripture, and trusted community. Let God's gentle hands guide you toward wholeness.

Day 7: 6 Overcoming Fear and Anxiety

Devotional: Replacing Fear with God's Power and Love

Fear and anxiety often linger long after abuse ends, leaving us feeling powerless. Yet God has given us a Spirit of power, love, and self-discipline—not fear.

You are stronger than your fears because God equips you to overcome them. Trusting Him brings courage. His love covers your anxiety with peace, and His Spirit empowers you to walk in freedom.

Today, reject timidity. Face your fears with God-given strength. Remember that no weapon or threat from the past will prevail against you because God protects and renews you.

Devotional: Experience God's Refreshing Rest Today

Emotional exhaustion can drain your soul after abuse. God offers restoration and guidance to those who seek Him. His desire is to refresh and renew your spirit, leading you on paths of peace and purpose.

Allow God to restore your soul today. Spend quiet moments with Him, inviting His healing presence to calm your mind and heart. Trust His guidance and embrace the rest He offers.

As you lean into His restoration, you will find new strength to continue your recovery journey with hope and resilience.

Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness for Your Freedom

Forgiveness can be one of the most difficult steps in recovery. It doesn't mean forgetting or excusing abuse, but releasing the hold that bitterness and anger have on your heart.

God's forgiveness of us is the model and motivation. Just as Christ forgave, we are called to extend forgiveness, not for the abuser's sake alone, but for our own healing and freedom.

Today, ask God for the grace to forgive—even if it is just a small step. Forgiveness loosens chains and opens space for healing, peace, and renewed strength.

Submitting your ways to God invites His wisdom into your life. Even when the way is unclear, He is faithful to lead you on a straight path toward healing and hope.

Choose today to lean not on your own understanding, but to seek God's direction in every decision. His truth will be your compass and anchor.

Take captive every unhealthy thought and replace it with God's promises. Think about what is true, pure, and lovely. This intentional practice reshapes your spirit and aligns you with God's healing.

Today, identify negative thought patterns and invite the Holy Spirit to bring mental renewal. Your mind is a battlefield, but it is also an opportunity for victory and freedom in Christ.
