Each day includes Scripture to inspire, a devotional to nurture your soul, reflection questions to deepen your understanding, journaling prompts to process your journey, and prayers to connect intimately with God's healing presence.

As you walk through these days, be gentle with yourself. Some reflections may bring up hard emotions—this is part of the healing process. Remember, you are not alone; God's faithful love surrounds you and is at work, reclaiming your heart piece by piece. **Your recovery is not just possible—it is promised.**







Let this time be a sacred space where God meets you with mercy and hope, leading you toward wholeness and renewed strength.

Devotional: God Draws Near to Your Broken Heart

Emotional neglect leaves wounds that often feel invisible but deeply painful. On day one of this journey, we meet the Lord as the One who is intimately close to our brokenness. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is not distant or unaware of our inner pain; He draws near to the brokenhearted.

Sometimes, when emotional needs go unmet, people feel crushed and alone. Yet God's word assures us He saves those crushed in spirit—offering hope rather than despair. This is a promise that you are never beyond the reach of His love.

Take a moment to breathe deeply and invite God into your pain. You can bring your feelings of loneliness, grief, or emptiness before Him. He listens and wants to heal your heart. As Isaiah 41:10 encourages, God's presence casts out fear, inviting us to trust Him with our struggles.

Day 2: OGod's Healing Waters

Psalm 147:3 beautifully describes God's tender care—He binds up our wounds, showing the tender, personal nature of His healing. Unlike human solutions, God's healing is complete and transformative.

Devotional: Step Into New Life Through Christ Today

Day 4: **(** God's Protection in Vulnerability

Healing from emotional neglect often requires exposing our vulnerabilities.

This can feel risky because past neglect might cause us to guard our hearts tightly. Yet, God invites us to find refuge under His wings—a tender image of protection and care.

Devotional: Let God's Joy Strengthen Your Heart
