Devotional: God's Personal Pursuit of Every Lost Soul

The diligent search: The woman's tireless effort to find one lost coin teaches us about God's intimate and persistent care for every person. Day 3: WE Embracing God's Joy and Sharing it

Devotional: Reflecting and Sharing God's Joy in Salvation

Sharing joy: The woman's reaction to finding the coin is to invite others to join in the celebration. This reminds us that God's joy over redemption is meant to be shared and expressed communally. When we experience God's restorative love, our natural response is to invite others into that joy.

Living in God's joy daily: Jesus desires that His joy become complete in us, filling every aspect of our lives. This joy is not dependent on circumstances but flows from knowing we are loved, found, and accepted by God.

Be a bearer of joy: As recipients of God's joy, we are called to reflect that joy outwardly—encouraging others, celebrating recovery, and manifesting God's love in tangible ways. Let your life be a beacon that draws others to the joy of salvation.
