



Devotional: Discerning False Conquest Before Christ's Return

The first seal introduces a rider on a white horse, symbolizing conquest. At first glance, it might appear to represent Christ, as He is also depicted on a white horse later in Revelation. However, this rider seems to represent false peace or deceptive conquest—a counterfeit authority that precedes genuine divine intervention.

This seal marks the beginning of God's judgments that unveil the state of the world—where falsehoods and battles for power rage. It contrasts with Christ's ultimate victory by revealing the struggles that shake the earth before His return.

Consider how God's justice works through exposing falsehood, and His mercy allows time for repentance even through judgment. This rider challenges us to discern between worldly conquest and God's true reign.

The red horse and its rider symbolize war and bloodshed. This seal reveals the severity of conflict unleashed upon the earth as a result of humanity's fallen state and sinfulness. Peace is removed, and violence increases, demonstrating the tragic consequences of rebellion against God.

God's justice allows this judgment to expose human sin and the destructive nature of turning from Him. Yet, His mercy still calls for repentance amidst chaos.



Through this judgment, God demonstrates His authority over natural and human realms alike, showing that no force can escape His justice. It also serves as a warning that sin's destructive impact reaches beyond people to the whole creation.

We are reminded to stand in awe of God's power and repent before His justice falls fully.






