Devotional: Choose Humility to Honor God at Work

Humility is a powerful mark of a Christlike reputation. In a world where ambition often drives success, Scripture calls us to a different path—valuing others above ourselves and serving with a heart of humility (Philippians 2:3-4).

Christ Himself exemplified ultimate humility by leaving heaven's glory to serve humanity and ultimately sacrifice Himself for us. When we reflect that humility in the workplace, we foster teamwork, seek solutions without pride, and listen genuinely to others. This attitude not only creates a positive environment but also witnesses to God's kingdom culture.
