Devotional: Lead with Contentment and Christ's Strength

1 Timothy 6:6 reminds us that godliness paired with contentment brings true gain. Leaders who embody this are able to model peace and stability even in uncertain times.

Psalm 16:11 shows that joy and fulfillment flow when we remain anchored in God's presence. As a single adult leader, grounding yourself in Christ's sufficiency will enable you to lead with confidence, free from anxiety or unmet expectations.

Contentment is not complacency but a settled heart that trusts God fully. Let this truth transform how you lead today.

Devotional: Integrity and Humility Define True Leaders

Effective leadership is anchored in both integrity and humility. Especially as a single adult, you may face societal pressures to prove your worth through achievements or titles, but biblical leadership calls for transparency and servant-heartedness.

Proverbs 11:3 highlights the guiding power of integrity — upright leaders walk a path that is trustworthy and compelling. Without it, leadership collapses under duplicity and inconsistency.

Micah 6:8 lays out God's ethical leadership expectations: justice, mercy, and humility before God. These qualities are the heart of godly leadership, inviting others to trust and follow.

Philippians 2:3 challenges leaders to cast aside selfish ambition, embracing humility by valuing others' needs and perspectives. For single adults, this posture of servant leadership dismantles stereotypes and models Christlike love to the entire church.

Let your leadership shine by remaining honest, just, and humble. These characteristics build trust and open doors for lasting impact.

As a single adult leader, nurture your passion by aligning your heart wholly with God's mission and serve with determined faithfulness. Your zeal will encourage others and impact the church body profoundly.

3.	Are there ways to re-energize your spiritual fervor in service to God?






