Devotional: Depend on God for Leadership Wisdom

Devotional: Bold Truth-Telling in Turbulent Times

Truth-telling leaders are critical in political turmoil, where misinformation and fear run rampant. Paul's prayer in Ephesians highlights the need for boldness to proclaim God's message fearlessly.

Speaking truth requires courage to stand when others retreat. Acts records how early believers prayed for boldness to face opposition, modeling that courage is both God-given and prayer-fueled. Proverbs compares the righteous' boldness to a lion's strength, reminding us not to shrink back.

In your leadership, embrace this courage to speak honestly and lovingly. Bold truth rooted in grace can cut through confusion, provide clarity, and inspire integrity even when it's difficult.

Devotional: Humility Fuels Influence and Stability

True leadership mirrors Jesus' example of servant leadership, putting others' needs before personal ambition. Jesus reminds Peter that greatness in God's kingdom means humble service, which counters culture's typical leadership models.

By serving others, leaders build trust and create stability amid chaos. John's account of Jesus washing the disciples' feet embodies humble love and care as foundations for authentic leadership. Paul urges humility, emphasizing others above self-interest.

In political turmoil, serve your team, community, and even opponents with grace, reflecting Christ's heart. This humble service becomes a beacon of hope and order.
