#### Devotional: Embrace Servant Leadership Like Jesus

**Leadership in Christian non-profits** begins with embracing the model Jesus provided: servant leadership. In Mark 10:43–45, Jesus teaches us that true greatness comes from serving others, not seeking power or status. This counters many worldly views and reminds us that our roles are to uplift others through humble service.

John 13 records Jesus washing His disciples' feet, an act of humble service even as their Teacher and Lord. It calls leaders to serve in practical, often unseen ways. Philippians 2 further challenges us to prioritize others' needs with humility—critical for leaders balancing compassion and strategy.

Serve your team and those you serve with Christ-like love, remembering that leadership is about lifting others up and pointing them toward God's purposes.

#### Devotional: Seek God's Wisdom When Strategizing

This posture invites God into your strategy, making your leadership ministry-driven, effective, and aligned with His purposes.
