Devotional: Leading with Compassion for the City's Needs

Devotional: Spirit-Led Boldness in Urban Outreach

Leading in urban ministry requires courage that only the Holy Spirit can provide. The early church faced intense opposition, yet they turned to God asking for boldness to proclaim the gospel (*Acts 4:29*).

Your leadership must be marked by fearless clarity—speaking truth in love, standing up for justice, and confronting issues that can overwhelm a community. This boldness isn't arrogance, but a spirit-infused strength described in *2 Timothy 1:7*: power, love, and self-discipline.
