Day 1: 7 Foundations of Godly Leadership

#### Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."
- Psalm 111:10 "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding."







Day 1: 7 Foundations of Godly Leadership

#### Devotional: Trusting God as the Leader's First Step

Leadership begins with a foundation of trust in God. Proverbs 3:5–6 reminds us that true wisdom and direction come when we rely fully on the Lord rather than our own limited understanding. When raising daughters to lead, teaching them to trust God is crucial. It encourages them to seek guidance beyond worldly wisdom and to acknowledge God as their ultimate leader.

Children watch closely how we live out our faith. When we demonstrate daily dependence on God, it models the humility and strength that leadership requires. The courage called for in Joshua 1:9 isn't self-confidence alone, but rooted confidence in God's presence with us in every challenge. Additionally, Psalm 111:10 reveals that a reverent fear of God forms the basis of true wisdom and understanding.

Leaders who begin with these truths are better equipped to lead with grace and strength, grounded in a relationship with God who never fails them.

#### Devotional: Empowered by the Spirit to Lead Boldly

Courage is an essential characteristic for leadership—especially in a world that often challenges young women. 2 Timothy 1:7 promises that the Spirit of God empowers us to overcome timidity with power, love, and self-discipline. These qualities enable leaders to face challenges head-on, love others, and maintain self-control under pressure.

Deuteronomy 31:6 encourages us not to fear because God is always present, offering strength and support. The story of Esther reminds us that God places leaders in roles "for such a time as this," inviting your daughters to recognize their own moments of purpose and bravery.

Cultivating courage means nurturing a faith that trusts God's presence and power even in uncertain circumstances. Encourage your daughters to step boldly into opportunities to lead, knowing they do so backed by divine strength.

- Proverbs 31:26 "She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue."
- Ecclesiastes 7:12 "Wisdom preserves those who have it."







#### Devotional: Seeking God's Wisdom for Leadership

Wisdom is the compass that guides true leaders through complex decisions and challenges. James 1:5 reassures us that God generously grants wisdom to anyone who asks. When raising daughters to lead, encouraging a habit of prayerful seeking after wisdom is vital.

The Proverbs 31 woman exemplifies wisdom and faithful instruction, using her words to guide and nurture others. Wisdom preserves a leader, enabling her to navigate relationships and responsibilities with grace and prudence (Ecclesiastes 7:12).

Helping your daughter see that leadership involves both knowledge and godly insight encourages her to rely on God continually. Teach her to ask God for wisdom daily, making decisions rooted not only in intellect but in divine understanding.

#### Devotional: Leading with Humility and Kindness

Leadership without grace can become harsh, but leadership with grace transforms relationships and environments. Colossians 4:6 challenges leaders to let their speech be full of grace, enabling them to respond wisely and kindly in any situation.

Grace in leadership requires humility, patience, and love—as emphasized in Ephesians 4:2. These qualities help your daughter lead not through force or power but through compassion and kindness. The fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 5 reflects the character traits that produce lasting influence and inspire trust.

Guiding your daughter to embody grace prepares her to be a leader who lifts others up and navigates challenges with gentleness and strength. Encourage her to adopt a leadership style that values people, listens deeply, and responds with understanding.

- Acts 4:29 "Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness."
- Psalm 27:1 "The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?"







#### Devotional: Standing Firm in Faith and Conviction

**Leaders must often stand firm in their convictions, even when facing opposition or risk.** The story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego is a powerful example of courageous conviction. Their refusal to compromise their faith, trusting God regardless of the outcome, models how leaders can hold unwavering beliefs with boldness and peace.

Acts 4:29 encourages believers to seek God's enablement to speak with great boldness despite threats or challenges. Psalm 27 reminds us that when God is our stronghold, fear loses its grip. These truths inspire your daughter to be courageous in her convictions, standing for truth and righteousness even when it's difficult.

Teaching your daughter to base her leadership on firm values and faith will empower her to navigate challenges with strength and courage.

#### Devotional: Leading by Serving Others Humbly

**True leadership is marked by a heart to serve, not to be served.** Jesus' words in Mark 10 teach us that greatness in leadership comes through humility and service to others. This counters worldly ideas of leadership as power and status, instead inviting leaders to prioritize the needs of those they lead.

John 13's foot-washing example shows Christ's humility and love in action. Philippians 2 encourages valuing others above ourselves and looking out for their interests. Teaching your daughter servant leadership helps her develop compassion, empathy, and a heart aligned with Christ's example.

Encourage your daughter to seek ways to lead by serving, understanding that humility and love amplify her strength and influence.

#### Devotional: Living and Leading with Integrity

Integrity is the bedrock of lasting and effective leadership. Psalm 15 highlights that those who dwell with God live blamelessly, do what is right, and speak truth from their hearts. Encouraging your daughter to lead with honesty and righteousness builds a foundation others can trust.

Proverbs 11 reminds us that integrity guides leaders safely, while duplicity destroys. 1 Timothy 4 motivates young leaders to set an example in conduct, speech, love, faith, and purity. Your daughter's leadership will shine brightest when rooted in integrity and purpose aligned with God's standards.

Helping her prioritize character over popularity or success prepares her to impact the world for God's glory.
