Your Verse

Mark 10:42-45 - "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant... For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve..."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Philippians 2:3 - "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."*
- *John 13:14 - "Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet."*



Day 1: 🌿 The Heart of a Servant Leader

Devotional: Embrace Servant Leadership Like Jesus

Leadership in the church begins with the heart of a servant. Jesus sets the ultimate example: He did not seek to elevate Himself but humbled Himself to serve. As a deacon or elder, your leadership is not about status or control but about loving and serving your congregation.

Serving others means putting their needs before your own ambitions. It calls for humility—a willingness to set aside personal pride and to lead by example. Your Verse

1 Timothy 3:8-10 - "Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain..."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Titus 1:7-8 - "An overseer must be above reproach, not arrogant or quick-tempered... but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled."*
- *Proverbs 11:3 - "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity."*



Day 2:  Leading with Integrity

Devotional: Upholding Integrity in Leadership

Integrity is the backbone of trustworthy leadership. Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus provide clear qualifications for those who lead in the church: dignity, honesty, self-control, and above reproach.

Leaders must be consistent in word and deed, avoiding hypocrisy or moral compromise. Your actions speak louder than titles—church members look to elders and deacons as examples of Christlike character. When integrity shines, it builds trust and fosters unity within the church.

Consider how your personal life aligns with the high standards set forth in Scripture. Are you transparent and honest, or are there areas where duplicity might be creeping in? In humility, seek God's help to live a consistent, honorable life that equips you to lead well.

Your Verse

1 Peter 5:2-3 - "Be shepherds of God's flock... not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Galatians 6:9 - "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."*
- *Colossians 3:12 - "Therefore, as God's chosen people... clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."*



Devotional: Exhibit Patience and Gentleness in Leadership

Leading a church body requires enduring patience and a gentle heart. Peter's letter reminds elders and deacons to shepherd the flock not with domineering authority but by example—modeling Christ's compassionate leadership.

Patience helps you persevere through challenges and conflicts within the church. Gentleness opens doors to hearts, promotes healing, and fosters trust.

In your leadership, reflect on how you respond when things are difficult. Are you swift to anger or slow to listen? Do you approach people with gentleness or harshness? Your maturity in Christ will be displayed not only in your decisions but in the tone and spirit with which you lead.

- *Colossians 1:9 - "We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives."*

Devotional: Seek and Depend on God's Wisdom

Leadership decisions are often complex and require divine wisdom. The apostle James encourages believers to ask God for wisdom freely and without hesitation. As deacons and elders, this promise is especially relevant because your guidance directly impacts the spiritual well-being of the church.

Relying on your own judgment alone is inadequate. Instead, cultivate a habit of prayerfully seeking God's counsel in every matter—big or small. God desires to direct your steps, enabling you to lead wisely and effectively.

Reflect on how frequently you seek God's wisdom in your leadership activities. Are you quick to make decisions independently, or do you wait on His guidance? Trust Him to provide clarity and insight as you follow His leading.

- *Proverbs 22:4 - "Humility is the fear of the Lord; its wages are riches and honor and life."*



Day 5:  Staying Humble Amid Authority

Devotional: Maintain Humility in Leadership Authority

Authority in the church is a trust, not a platform for pride. Micah's timeless reminder highlights that walking humbly with God is part of a life pleasing to Him.

When you lead, guard against pride creeping in. It can be subtle but destructive, distorting your leadership and hurting those you serve. Humility does not mean weakness but strength under control—acknowledging your dependence on God and valuing others above yourself.

Ask yourself regularly: Am I walking humbly with God in my leadership? How can you cultivate a continual posture of humility in your daily tasks and interactions?

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- *James 2:13 – "Mercy triumphs over judgment."*



Devotional: Lead with Justice Anchored in Compassion

As spiritual leaders, balancing justice and compassion is essential. The call to administer true justice is paired with the call to show mercy and compassion. Elders and deacons are often called to make decisions affecting people's lives, so justice must be tempered with empathy.

Compassion allows leaders to see beyond rules to the hearts of those they serve. It enables a ministry of restoration rather than condemnation.

Consider how you administer justice in your ministry. Are you quick to judge, or do you genuinely pursue the well-being of others? Seeking God's heart for justice and mercy transforms your leadership into a reflection of His perfect character.

Devotional: Cultivate Mature, Grace-Filled Leadership

Spiritual maturity equips leaders to serve the church with grace and discernment. Hebrews encourages believers to grow beyond spiritual infancy into maturity, capable of wise judgment and self-control. Elders and deacons embody this maturity as they guide the church.

Grace is the balance that allows you to lead firmly yet lovingly. It tempers authority with kindness, patience, and forgiveness. Mature leadership demonstrates gentleness and the ability to teach without resentment.

Reflect on your growth journey in leadership. How are you practicing discernment and grace daily? Leading with maturity is an ongoing process—rely on God to develop these qualities continually.
