Devotional: Embracing God's Guidance in Uncertainty

Transitions in your career can stir anxiety and second-guessing, but Proverbs 3:5-6 calls us to a different posture: *trusting God wholeheartedly.* When pathways are unclear, it's temptation to rely on our own logic or fears. Devotional: Asking God for Guidance in Choices

In times of career uncertainty, the weight of decisions can feel overwhelming. James 1:5 promises that God generously gives wisdom when we ask. This is an invitation to come humbly before God, acknowledging we need His insight above our own.

Psalm 32:8 reassures us that God will personally instruct and guide us, watching over our paths with care. This means no career decision happens apart from His loving oversight. God's guidance is not distant but intimate and active in our daily choices.

Your Verse

Devotional: Strength to Overcome Fear in Leadership

Leading through change often means stepping into the unknown and facing fears. In Joshua 1:9, God commands His servant (and now us) to be strong and courageous, assuring His abiding presence wherever we go.

This is not a simple suggestion but a divine command filled with a promise: God will not leave or forsake us. The foundation for courage is God's unchanging companionship during uncertain times.

Isaiah 41:10 echoes this encouragement—not to fear or be discouraged because God strengthens and helps us. When fear threatens to paralyze leadership, remember the Spirit within you is powerful, loving, and self-controlled (2 Timothy 1:7). You are equipped not to shrink back but to press forward with God's strength.

Today, identify fears or discouragements that hinder your leadership. Offer them to God and embrace His command to be courageous, trusting He sustains you through every challenge.
