Devotional: Finding Courage in God's Presence

Devotional: Leading with Unwavering Integrity

Integrity is often tested in leadership, especially when you stand alone as a Christian voice. Proverbs 11:3 highlights how integrity acts as a guiding light, steering you steadily through ethical dilemmas and pressures. When your character is rooted in Christ, your decisions become trustworthy and impactful.

True leadership is not about popularity but about faithfully modeling godly values. Paul challenges Timothy to set an example in every aspect of life — speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity. This sets a high standard but also a clear calling: your actions and choices influence others, even subtly.

Reflect on how your integrity impacts those around you and consider the power of quiet faithfulness. Though you may sometimes feel unseen or unappreciated, your commitment to doing what is right echoes God's glory. Trust that your integrity plants seeds for God's kingdom, influencing your workplace in ways beyond measurement.
