#### Devotional: Lead by Serving Others Humbly

**Servant leadership** is at the heart of Christ's example and is essential for mission trip leaders. Jesus taught that to lead effectively, we must first serve others with humility. This challenges the worldly view of leadership driven by status or control. Instead, you are called to place your team's needs above your own and empower every member.

As a mission trip leader, your role requires you to model humility, even when pressures mount. Your attitude sets the tone for the entire team and invites them into a culture of mutual respect and care. Remember that leadership is not about commanding but about *walking alongside* your team, lifting burdens, and showing the love of Christ in tangible ways. Each act of service strengthens unity and opens hearts to the gospel mission.

Take time today to ask God to cultivate a humble spirit in you. Reflect on how you can serve your team better and lead by example, letting Christ's love shine through your actions.

#### Devotional: Trust God's Guidance Through Change

Leading a mission trip often involves unexpected changes — weather conditions, travel delays, or shifts in plans. This calls for a heart that trusts God *above* circumstances and remains flexible to His leading. Proverbs 3:5–6 encourages us to rely fully on the Lord rather than our limited understanding.

Adaptability in leadership is not about being passive or indecisive, but about staying open to God's guidance and ready to shift when He directs. When obstacles arise, rather than reacting with frustration, seek God's wisdom with a prayerful heart. Ask Him to open new doors and help you persevere in harmony with your team.

As you lead, remind your team that God is sovereign over every detail, and our mission is guided by His purpose. Flexibility builds resilience and demonstrates trust in God's perfect plan, even in uncertainty. Today's reflection invites you to surrender your agenda, embrace changes joyfully, and let God's Spirit guide your path.

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Day 3: Depending on God's Strength

#### Devotional: God's Strength in Your Weakness

Leadership can be exhausting. Bearing responsibility and addressing diverse needs may leave you feeling weak or overwhelmed. Yet God reminds us through Paul's words in 2 Corinthians that His grace is sufficient, and His power is revealed most clearly in our weakness.

**Dependence on God** is the antidote to burnout and pride. When you acknowledge your limitations, you open the door for God to empower you to lead beyond your natural capacity. Prayer becomes your lifeline, and Scripture your anchor.

Reflect on times when God's strength has lifted you in seemingly impossible situations. Carry this assurance as you lead your team. Your leadership flourishes not because of your own might but through God's sustaining grace. Invite Him continually to renew your spirit and give you courage in every challenge.

#### Devotional: Cast a Clear, Spirit-Led Vision

Effective leadership requires a clear vision that unites and motivates your team towards a common goal. As a mission trip leader, you hold the responsibility to communicate the purpose of your journey distinctly and passionately. Habakkuk reminds us to "write down the revelation" so it is clear and inspiring.

**Vision-casting** is more than logistics; it's about awakening hearts to God's mission. When your team understands the spiritual and practical significance of their work, their commitment deepens and their enthusiasm grows. It also helps them navigate challenges with hope and purpose.

Pray for a clear and compelling vision for your trip. Seek God's revelation and be intentional in sharing it repeatedly. Encourage your team to embrace the vision wholeheartedly, reminding them that their contributions matter deeply in God's Kingdom work.
