Day 1: SEmbracing Servant Leadership

Devotional: Lead by Serving: The Heart of Christian Leadership

True leadership according to Jesus is rooted in service. As you prepare to lead your book club, remember that your role is to serve the members, not to dominate conversations or impose your views. Jesus inverted the world's concept of authority by modeling humility and servant leadership.

Leading with humility means prioritizing the spiritual growth and wellbeing of each member. It means facilitating rather than dictating, listening more than speaking, and creating an atmosphere where everyone feels valued and heard. A servant leader fosters unity and openness, enabling authentic dialogue to flourish.

When you embrace servant leadership, you set a powerful example that encourages group members to follow Christ's example too. Your leadership becomes a ministry, not a duty, inspiring transformation both in yourself and the group.

Devotional: Lead with Confidence Rooted in Scripture
