Introduction

Welcome to this 3-day study on the importance of learning from correction.

The Bible repeatedly affirms that receiving correction with an open heart is essential to growing in wisdom and living a fruitful life. Proverbs 12:1 declares, "Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but whoever hates correction is stupid." This strong statement reminds us that correction is not something to fear or reject. Instead, it is a precious tool God uses to teach, refine, and guide us toward His best.

Every Christian encounters moments of correction—whether from God's Word, trusted mentors, or even our own conscience when illuminated by the Spirit. Over the next three days, we will explore scriptures that highlight the value of correction, the heart attitude required to receive it, and practical ways to apply it to our lives. You will be encouraged to reflect on how correction has shaped you and consider areas where God may be inviting you to receive His discipline anew. Remember, correction is an expression of love and a gift from God to help us become more like Christ. Let's embrace this opportunity with open hearts and minds as we seek God's wisdom together.















Your Verse

Proverbs 12:1 – Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but whoever hates correction is stupid.

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 3:11–12 My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke.
- Hebrews 12:11 No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later it produces a harvest of righteousness.







Devotional: Welcome Correction to Grow in Wisdom

Proverbs 12:1 sets a clear tone: welcoming correction is crucial to gaining true knowledge and wisdom. When we love discipline, we signal a heart ready to be trained and refined. This discipline may come through God's Word, trusted mentors, or circumstances, but God's loving hand is behind it all. Sometimes, correction can feel uncomfortable or even painful, but Hebrews 12:11 reminds us this temporary discomfort produces long-term righteousness and growth.

It's easy to resist correction because it shines light on our flaws and challenges our pride. But resisting correction closes the door to wisdom and maturity. Instead, we are called to embrace it as a vital part of God's shaping process — like a loving parent guiding a child. By accepting correction with humility, we participate in God's transformative work in our lives.

Today, ask yourself: How do I respond to correction? Do I resist, resent, or embrace it? What might God be trying to teach me through His discipline today?

2.	How has a past experience of correction helped you grow?
3.	In what ways can you cultivate a heart that loves discipline?

3.	Reflect on traits you need God to correct in your life.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for Your loving correction in my life. Help me to embrace Your discipline with a humble and teachable heart. Teach me to see correction not as punishment but as a tool for growth and wisdom. Give me strength to overcome pride and to welcome Your guidance every day. May Your Word shape me into the person You created me to be. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*















Your Verse

Proverbs 15:31 - Whoever heeds life-giving correction will be at home among the wise.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 94:12 Blessed is the one You discipline, Lord, the one You teach from your law.
- Proverbs 9:8 Do not rebuke mockers or they will hate you; rebuke the wise and they will love you.







Devotional: Receiving Correction with the Right Heart

The Bible speaks often about the importance of the condition of our heart when receiving correction. Proverbs 15:31 tells us that those who listen to correction live wisely. This suggests it's not just the correction itself, but our attitude toward it that determines our growth. A heart that is open, humble, and willing to learn aligns with God's purposes and finds a place among the wise.

Psalm 94:12 calls correction 'blessing' and 'teaching from God's law.' This highlights that divine discipline is an expression of God's covenant love, meant to guide us in right living. On the other hand, Proverbs 9:8 highlights the contrast between scoffing at correction and loving it — the wise love to be taught, while the proud resist.

When you hear correction, do you shrink back or lean in? Consider that God's correction is not an attack but an invitation to grow deeper in wisdom and into His likeness.

1.	How can you cultivate a heart that treasures correction?
	What pride or fear might hinder you from accepting correction gracefully?
	How does recognizing correction as an expression of God's love change your perspective?







Journaling Prompts

Describe what an 'open heart' toward correction looks like in your daily life.
Recall someone who taught you correction lovingly and what impact that had.
Pray over areas of pride that make it hard to accept correction and journal your feelings.







Prayer for Today

Father, I ask You to soften my heart today. Remove any pride or fear that causes me to reject correction. Teach me to love Your discipline as a form of Your perfect love and care. Help me to receive correction with gratitude and openness, so I may grow in wisdom and be at home among the wise. Thank You for never giving up on me. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Day 3: **B** Growing in Wisdom Through Correction

Devotional: Correction Leads to Life and Righteousness

Proverbs 10:17 highlights the ultimate outcome of embracing correction: it leads us on the path to life. Accepting correction steers us away from destructive choices and toward a fulfilling, godly life. Job 5:17 echoes this by calling the one who accepts God's correction blessed. This blessing is not always easy in the moment, but it paves the way to righteousness and blessing.

Moreover, 2 Timothy 3:16 reminds us that Scripture itself is the ultimate source of correction. God's Word is alive and powerful—equipping us, rebuking us, correcting, and training us so that we can live in a way that pleases Him. As we learn to receive correction, the Bible becomes our guidepost to continual growth and transformation.

Consider today how correction has shaped your life and what God may still be asking you to surrender to Him. Each act of submission to His discipline brings you closer to abundant life in Him.
