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Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible study plan on "Leaving a Cross-Centered Inheritance." As men, we often think about what legacy we will leave behind — financial assets, worldly achievements, or titles. However, the most enduring inheritance isn't about money or possessions, but rather the spiritual gifts, faith, and character we pass on to those we love.

Devotional: Start Building Your Spiritual Legacy Today

Devotional: Fan the Flame of Your Spiritual Gifts

The Holy Spirit has placed unique spiritual gifts within you. Just as a dormant fire can be overlooked and forgotten, so can our God-given abilities if we neglect to nurture them. Paul's call to Timothy is a call for all men to actively fan into flame the gifts God has entrusted to them.

Spiritual gifts are not simply for personal benefit but to serve God's kingdom and others. Whether your gift is encouragement, teaching, leadership, faith, or another, it demands attention, practice, and surrender to God's guidance.

Sometimes fears, busyness, or distractions can cause spiritual gifts to lie dormant. This day challenges you to identify any spiritual gifts you may have overlooked or underused and ask God how to activate them for His glory.

As you seek to fan your spiritual gifts into flame, remember God's power works best through willing and humble hearts. Your active involvement in this process invites God's presence to deepen your effectiveness and impact.

- 1 Peter 1:6-7 "Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy."







Devotional: Let Trials Shape Your Spiritual Character

Challenges shape and refine our character in lasting ways. Men are often tempted to hide from trials or grow bitter and angry when difficulties arise. Scripture reveals, however, that God uses hardships as a refining fire to form perseverance and mature faith.

When we choose joy and trust in God amid trials, our character deepens and our spiritual inheritance strengthens. This maturity transcends circumstances and becomes a witness to others.

Think about men in the Bible like Joseph, who endured betrayal and imprisonment, yet remained faithful and grew in godly character. His legacy impacted countless lives, proving trials can be fertile ground for spiritual gifts to flourish.

So today, lean into challenges as opportunities for growth rather than setbacks, trusting that God is working all things for your good and His glory.

Devotional: Reflect Christ's Love in Your Relationships
