Day 1: A Remember Your Journey









Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: Honoring God by Sharing Your Journey

Our spiritual journey is the foundation of the legacy we leave. Psalm 78:4 reminds us of the importance of recounting God's mighty works to the next generation. As men, our experiences with God—trials, victories, and moments of grace—are the stories that will shape and inspire our families.

Document your faith journey, remembering how God's guidance has directed your steps. This helps your loved ones understand not only what you believe but why you believe it. These stories become the spiritual DNA you pass on.

Deuteronomy calls us to impress God's commandments on our children's hearts, making faith a vital and practical part of their lives. When you share your journey, you provide context and depth that set the stage for their own faith.

Consider the faith heritage Paul refers to in 2 Timothy—it's more than theology; it's a lived experience passed from generation to generation, often through women in the family, but also through men who lead by example.

Devotional: Building a Legacy Through Godly Character

Character shapes legacy more than possessions do. Proverbs 20:7 teaches that the integrity of a righteous man blesses his children. When writing your spiritual will, emphasizing godly character communicates the kind of life you desire for your family to emulate.

Paul calls men to follow Christ's example and to become role models of faith and conduct. Your lifestyle, choices, and daily attitudes form the blueprint your family will follow.

The Fruit of the Spirit in Galatians exemplifies the qualities that reflect Christ's character. As you consider which traits you want to pass on, ask God to cultivate these qualities in you so they can naturally overflow to your family.

Strive not for perfection but for authenticity and growth. Document how you have pursued godliness, where you have struggled, and what victories remind you of God's grace. These honest reflections foster genuine growth for future generations.

Day 3: Share Your Faith Convictions

Devotional: Defining and Declaring Your Faith

Faith convictions are the foundation of your spiritual will. Joshua's declaration in Joshua 24:15 serves as a powerful statement of intentional commitment. Defining clearly what you believe as a family prepares them for challenges ahead.

Paul instructs in Titus that faithfulness extends beyond words—it is lived out visibly. Your convictions must be coupled with example. Scripture, like Psalm 119, provides the light guiding those convictions.

Consider what core truths you want to be unmistakable in your spiritual will—beliefs about God, Christ, salvation, prayer, and godly living. Write these down with clarity and passion. This creates a firm anchor for your family when they face doubts or hardships.

Be specific and personal. Explain why these convictions are vital, perhaps referencing your own experiences and Scripture that has been especially meaningful along your journey.

Prayer for Today


