The sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, abused their priestly positions, showing blatant disrespect for God and the people. They took the best portions of sacrifices for themselves and treated the Lord's offerings with contempt. Their behavior was a direct violation of God's standards for worship and leadership.

Corruption in spiritual leadership can have devastating effects on a community and family. When those set apart for God's service sin, it dishonors God and harms His people. Today, consider the consequences of ignoring sin and the importance of godly integrity in leadership and family life.
