Your Verse

Mark 11:12-14 - "The next day as they were leaving Bethany, Jesus was hungry. Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 21:18–19 "Early in the morning, as Jesus was on his way back to the city, he was hungry. Seeing a fig tree by the road, he went up to it but found nothing on it except leaves. Then he said to it, 'May you never bear fruit again!'"
- Jeremiah 8:13 "I will hasten my punishing anger and inflict my fierce wrath on them. I will not change my plans; they will surely come to pass."







Devotional: Understanding the Context and Meaning

Jesus' encounter with the fig tree invites us to look beneath the surface — it's not merely about a fruitless tree but about spiritual expectations and realities. While the fig tree was out of season for fruit, Jesus expected to find something that indicated life and readiness — at least some early signs of figs. The tree's failure to produce fruit, despite appearing healthy, is a powerful metaphor for superficial faith or empty religiosity.

In the biblical context, fig trees often symbolized Israel and its people. A leafy fig tree without fruit suggested a hollow profession of faith and a warning sign of impending judgment when spiritual fruit is absent. Jesus' actions challenge us to consider our own lives: are we displaying leaves only, or are we bearing genuine fruit?

As we begin this Bible study, let us prepare to honestly examine ourselves in the light of Jesus' teaching, recognizing where we may be fruitless in our faith journey.

Mark 11:20–24 – "In the morning, as they went along, they saw the fig tree withered from the roots. Peter remembered and said, 'Rabbi, look! The fig tree you cursed has withered!'... 'Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:6 "But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind."
- Hebrews 11:1 "Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see."







Devotional: Faith's Role in Spiritual Growth and Action

The withering of the fig tree following Jesus' curse might seem harsh, but it highlights the potency of faith combined with obedience. Jesus used this moment to teach his disciples about the power of genuine faith — the kind that trusts God deeply and acts accordingly. Faith is not passive; it requires active belief and expectation that God moves when we pray with sincerity.

We see Jesus emphasizing that prayer, when paired with unwavering belief, is a conduit for God's power. So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?""
