Introduction

The story of Naboth and King Ahab is a powerful narrative found in 1 Kings 21. It vividly highlights the destructive power of *greed* and the grave consequences of *injustice*. Naboth owned a vineyard that King Ahab desired for his personal use, but Naboth's refusal to sell it sparked a chain of events that led to tragedy. This event reveals much about human nature, the abuse of power, and God's unwavering standards for justice.

Ahab, driven by greed and aided by Queen Jezebel's deception, orchestrated Naboth's death to seize the vineyard. However, God's justice ultimately confronts Ahab, demonstrating that no one is above divine law.

As we journey through this 7-day study, we will examine the characters' choices, the cultural and spiritual implications of their actions, and the lessons we can apply to our own lives to guard against greed and to stand firm in integrity. Let us approach this study with open hearts, seeking wisdom from God's word to guide our actions in a world often marked by selfishness and injustice. Day 1: B Naboth's Vineyard and Ahab's Desire

Your Verse

1 Kings 21:1-4 NIV - "Naboth had a vineyard in Jezreel, next to the palace of Ahab king of Samaria. Ahab said to Naboth, 'Let me have your vineyard to use for a vegetable garden..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 21:25 "The craving of a sluggard will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work."
- Luke 12:15 "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."







Day 1: B Naboth's Vineyard and Ahab's Desire

Devotional: Desire vs. Integrity: The Vineyard Conflict

Day 1 invites us to see the beginning of conflict rooted in desire. Naboth peacefully owned his vineyard, a cherished possession likely passed to him by his ancestors. Yet King Ahab's longing to add this land to his palace garden shows how desire can quickly lead to covetousness.

It's important to recognize the difference between a simple desire and a dangerous craving. Ahab doesn't just want the vineyard; he wants it for himself regardless of what it costs Naboth. This reveals a growing sense of entitlement and selfish ambition.

Greed blinds us to the rights, feelings, and dignity of others. In this passage, Naboth remains steadfast in honoring family heritage and God's law, showing integrity in the face of pressure. What can we learn from both men? How do desires shape our lives and decisions?

Day 2: Naboth's Faithful Refusal

Devotional: Standing Firm: Faith Over Fear

Naboth's response is a profound example of faithfulness to God's commands.

By refusing to sell his vineyard, Naboth was not merely protecting land but upholding God's law about inheritance and justice. It was customary and commanded to keep ancestral property intact.

His refusal is courageous — especially when it involved saying no to a king. In doing so, Naboth prioritized obedience to God over human authority and personal safety.

This teaches us about the importance of standing firm in our convictions when they align with God's truth, even when it's costly. Naboth's faith shines as a beacon of righteousness in the midst of moral compromise.

- Micah 6:8 "...walk humbly with your God, act justly and love mercy."







Day 3: 6 Jezebel's Deception and Evil Plot

Devotional: Deception's Cost: The Power of Falsehood

Here we witness how cunning deceit amplifies injustice. Jezebel's malicious plan to frame Naboth and have him killed reveals the dark heart behind greed —an abandonment of all moral boundaries to obtain what one desires.

This story warns us about the power of manipulation and falsehood. Jezebel uses her influence to pervert justice, showing no regard for truth or life.

God calls us to act justly and love mercy, yet Jezebel embodies everything God opposes. This challenges us to examine our own actions and attitudes: Are we complicit in unjust systems? Do we defend truth and the vulnerable, or do we remain silent?

Devotional: God Near the Brokenhearted

The death of Naboth is a heartbreaking picture of innocent suffering. Yet, even in this injustice, God's presence remains near those who grieve and suffer.

Naboth's story urges us to remember that God sees every act of evil and pain. His justice may seem delayed, but He is neither blind nor silent.

For those who experience loss or oppression, this passage offers comfort in the promise that God is close to broken hearts and will ultimately restore justice and freedom.







Reflect and Apply

1.	Have you experienced unjust suffering or pain? How did you find hope?
2.	What ways can you offer comfort to those who mourn or suffer injustice?
3.	How does knowing God is close to the brokenhearted shape your faith?

	Write about a personal experience of hardship and how your faith sustained you.
2.	List practical ways you can support those facing injustice or sorrow.
3.	Reflect on promises from God that bring you peace during trials.

1 Kings 21:17-24 NIV - "Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah the prophet: 'Go down to meet Ahab...'"

Supporting Scriptures

- Ecclesiastes 12:14 "For God will bring every deed into judgment..."
- Romans 12:19 "Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath..."







Devotional: God's Righteous Judgment and Mercy

God confronts Ahab's greed and injustice with a clear judgment through the prophet Elijah. This shows that no one, not even a king, is exempt from God's moral law.

God's justice is both righteous and patient. Though Ahab sinned, God offered a chance for repentance, highlighting God's mercy alongside His holiness.

This passage reminds believers that God sees all, judges all, and desires repentance. Our actions have consequences, but God's desire is for restoration rather than destruction.

2.	Have you experienced God's correction as an act of love? How?
3.	What areas of your life require repentance before God's judgment?

Devotional: Choose Integrity Over Greed

Reflecting on the entire story, the danger of greed emerges as a central theme. Greed not only destroys relationships but leads to injustice, heartbreak, and divine judgment.

Conversely, integrity aligns us with God's will and protects us from such pitfalls. Remaining faithful to God's principles enables us to live peacefully, honoring others and safeguarding our own souls.

Jesus' words remind us that true life is not found in possessions but in relationship with God and love for our neighbor. This day invites us to examine our hearts and pursue integrity above gain.
