Your Verse

Matthew 27:19 - While Pilate was sitting on the judge's seat, his wife sent him this message: "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man, because I have suffered a great deal today in a dream because of him."

- Genesis 37:5 Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers, they hated him all the more.

Devotional: God's Voice Through Dreams in Scripture

Dreams hold significant places in the biblical narrative. From Joseph's dreams in Genesis that foretold future events to Daniel's night visions that revealed mysteries, God often uses dreams to communicate with His people.

In Matthew 27:19, we see Pilate's wife experiencing a troubling dream about Jesus, causing her to send a warning to her husband. Though brief, this warning expresses her concern and foreshadows the innocent suffering Jesus was enduring.

Dreams in scripture remind us that God's communication is not limited to prophecy or sermons. Sometimes He uses personal, intimate ways to reach our hearts. Pilate's wife's dream was a divine interruption in an otherwise political and judicial drama.

As we begin this study, consider the Bible's perspective on dreams: they can be instruments of insight, warnings, encouragement, and revelation. God may speak to you through dreams or other quiet promptings. Stay open to His voice.

John 18:38 - Pilate said, "What is truth?" With this he went out again to the people gathered there and said, "I find no basis for a charge against him."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 15:1 Very early in the morning, the chief priests, with the elders, the teachers of the law and the whole Sanhedrin, made their plans.
- Luke 23:4 Then Pilate announced to the chief priests and the crowd, "I find no basis for a charge against this man."







Devotional: Truth and Courage Amid Trial

Situating Pilate's wife's warning requires understanding the broader trial setting. Pontius Pilate, as governor, balanced Roman law, political pressure, and personal ethics during Jesus' trial. Though he found no fault in Jesus, the demand for crucifixion pressed heavily upon him.

John 18:38 highlights Pilate's perplexing question, "What is truth?" This reveals his internal conflict and perhaps worldview skepticism.

Against this tumultuous backdrop, Pilate's wife's dream emerges as a divine whisper amid political tension and injustice. Her message to "have nothing to do with that innocent man" provides a timely warning that contrasts with the world's pressure to conform or condemn unjustly.

As followers of Christ, we can learn from this episode about standing strong in God's truth even when surrounded by confusion, opposition, or moral compromise.

Matthew 27:24 - When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but that instead an uproar was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. "I am innocent of this man's blood," he said.

- Romans 13:3 For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong.







Devotional: Courage to Speak God's Warning

Though unnamed in Scripture, Pilate's wife showed bravery by sending a warning to her powerful husband. Even when she risked dismissal or ignorance, she spoke out about what her dream revealed.

This reminds us that God can use anyone, regardless of position or status, to deliver vital messages. Her courage to intervene, however subtle, contrasts with Pilate's hesitancy and the crowd's demands.

Like Esther, who risked her royal position to save her people, Pilate's wife serves as a model of boldness in dangerous times. Her actions exemplify how God calls us to act when His truth is revealed, even when doing so brings uncertainty or risk.

Let us consider where we might be called to courageously speak or act today, trusting God's protection and purposes even when the stakes are high.

Your Verse

Ezekiel 33:7 - But if the watchman sees the sword coming and does not blow the trumpet to warn the people and the sword comes and takes someone's life, that person's life will be taken because of their sin, but I will hold the watchman accountable for their blood.

Supporting Scriptures

- Acts 20:31 So be on your guard! Remember that for three years I never stopped warning each of you night and day with tears.
- Proverbs 27:12 The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and pay the penalty.







Day 5: A Heeding God's Warnings

Devotional: Listening and Responding to Divine Warnings

Warnings play a critical role in God's relationship with humanity. Just as a watchman signals approaching danger, God sends warnings to protect and guide us.

Pilate's wife's caution to her husband is one such warning—meant to alert and protect. Ezekiel portrays the watchman's responsibility seriously; ignoring warnings can lead to consequences, but faithfully sounding the alarm serves life.
