Introduction

The Parable of the Rich Fool (Luke 12:13–21) is a profound and eye-opening teaching from Jesus about the dangers of greed, misplaced security, and the priority of eternal life over earthly riches. In this story, a wealthy man accumulates great wealth and plans to store it all for himself, thinking he has life and security for many years to come. However, God calls him a fool, reminding us that our lives and treasures ultimately belong to Him and that hoarding wealth without being rich toward God is vanity.

This 7-day study will guide you through the core lessons of this parable, helping you reflect on the nature of possessions, the impermanence of worldly riches, and what it means to live wisely in God's kingdom. Each day will include scripture reading, devotional insights, reflection questions, journaling prompts, and a focused prayer to deepen your understanding and application of this important teaching.

As you journey through this study, may you be inspired to evaluate your heart's priorities, embrace generosity, and discover the treasure that truly lasts—riches in God's grace and eternal kingdom. Let's get ready to open God's Word and learn from this timeless parable together.















Your Verse

Luke 12:13–21 NIV "Then he said to them, 'Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."

- Matthew 6:19–21 NIV "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth... but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven."
- 1 Timothy 6:9–10 NIV "People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap... the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil."







Devotional: Greed Is Not Life's Source

Jesus' teaching on greed and possessions is clear and challenging. In the opening verses of Luke 12, Jesus responds to a man's request for his brother's inheritance by warning the crowd about greed. This sets the stage for the Parable of the Rich Fool, which serves as a vivid example of misplaced trust in wealth.

The heart of the message is that life does not consist in having abundant possessions. This challenges our culture's common belief that more is better. Jesus invites us to examine where we place our security and what we truly value. The rich man believed his life depended on his stored-up wealth. But God revealed his foolishness, emphasizing that earthly wealth cannot guarantee life or meaning.

Today, reflect on your own perspective of possessions. Are they a source of security or potential stumbling block? As we continue this study, keep your heart open to God's teaching about what it means to be rich toward Him.

3.	In what ways can wealth become a false security in your life?

	Ask God to reveal any areas where greed or materialism may be influencing your heart.

Teach me to store up treasures in heaven and to be rich toward You. 

Luke 12:16–18 NIV "He said to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones...'"

Supporting Scriptures

Day 2: Free Rich Man's Mistake

Devotional: The Folly of Hoarding Wealth

The rich man's error lies in focusing solely on earthly abundance and comfort. His plan to build larger barns to store his surplus grain reveals a heart wrapped up in self-sufficiency and accomplishment. He does not consider others, nor does he acknowledge God's sovereign provision.

This attitude blinds him to the impermanence of life and the futility of hoarding wealth. The rich fool's security is in things that will rot or be stolen, not in God. His inward focus leads to pride and spiritual blindness.

God invites us to learn from this mistake by placing our trust in Him and living generously. The world encourages accumulation and control, but God's kingdom calls for faith, stewardship, and compassion.

Ask yourself, are you planning for bigger barns, or building treasures in heaven?



Devotional: The Fragility of Life

God's interruption reveals the rich man's tragic misunderstanding—he presumed he had many years to enjoy his wealth. The reality is that life is fragile and unknown, and death can come unexpectedly. The parable reminds us that earthly plans are always subject to God's sovereign timing.

This should humble us and encourage us to live with eternity in view. Instead of making life all about accumulating wealth for oneself, Jesus calls us to be ready and to invest in what truly lasts.

How are you preparing your heart for the uncertainties of life? Are you living with an eternal perspective? Today, meditate on the brevity of life and prioritize what matters most—your relationship with God and others.

Devotional: Rich Toward God

Jesus contrasts worldly wealth with true, spiritual wealth—being rich toward God. This means prioritizing a heart-centered relationship with God that impacts our lives and others positively.

Being rich toward God is characterized by generosity, faith, obedience, and humility. It reflects a surrendered life that treasures God's kingdom above material gain.

Wealth can be a blessing when used rightly, but it is not the ultimate goal. This day reminds us to examine what kind of 'rich' we are, encouraging us to develop spiritual richness that lasts beyond this life.

Devotional: Joyful Giving Reflects God's Heart

The parable encourages generosity as an expression of faith and trust in God's provision. Giving is a way to align ourselves with God's heart and acknowledge that everything we have is ultimately His.

Generosity breaks the shackles of greed and self-centeredness, opening us to experience joy and blessing. It is a tangible manifestation of being rich toward God. When we give, we partner with God's work on earth, bless others, and grow spiritually.

Reflect on how generosity changes our perspective on wealth and reveals the condition of our hearts. Ask God to cultivate a joyful spirit of giving in you that mirrors His abundant grace.

Devotional: Fixing Our Minds on Heaven

Jesus' parable calls us to set our minds and hearts on eternal realities rather than temporary earthly gain. It can be easy to get distracted by day-to-day concerns and material comfort. Yet, spiritual maturity requires that we intentionally focus on God's kingdom values.

Reflect on what consumes your thoughts and energies. Are they aligned with God's purposes? Are you fixing your eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith?

Adjusting our priorities means making conscious choices to follow Jesus faithfully, seeking His will above all else. Use today to renew your commitment to live with eternity in view, living in light of God's promises and kingdom.
