Devotional: Recognizing and Naming Your Offense

Offenses at work often sting deeply. A harsh email, a missed credit, or unfair criticism can ignite anger or bitterness inside us. Yet, the Bible calls us to an active choice—to *recognize those feelings and decide not to hold on to them.* Ephesians 4:31 urges us to eliminate bitterness and anger because they poison our hearts and relationships. By identifying offense, we create space for healing and growth.

When you notice hurt feelings or resentment rising, pause and ask yourself: "Why do I feel this way?" Do not bury the pain but acknowledge it.

Remember, forgiving does not mean condoning hurtful behavior, but it frees you from the burden of carrying offense. It is the first step toward peace.

Listening more and reacting less, as James advises, helps us understand others better and avoid misunderstandings.

Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness Over Bitterness

Forgiveness is a cornerstone of the Christian faith, especially when offenses seem hard to forgive. At work, offenses might repeat or come from difficult colleagues. Jesus teaches us that forgiveness is not limited—it's a continuous choice to release others from the debt of hurt.

Forgiving doesn't mean forgetting the wrong or excusing poor behavior, but it frees your soul from the heavy chain of resentment. It also aligns your heart with God's mercy and grace, positioning you for peace even amidst trials.

Romans encourages us to respond to enemies with kindness, breaking the cycle of offense. Such acts can soften hearts and build unexpected bridges. When you find it tough to forgive, remember that forgiveness is for your healing as much as theirs.

Psalm 147:3 - "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 53:5 "By his wounds we are healed."
- Jeremiah 30:17 "I will restore you to health and heal your wounds," declares the Lord."







Devotional: Trusting God to Heal Deep Hurt

Offenses at work can leave hidden wounds that affect our spirit and outlook. Sometimes the pain is not obvious to others but deeply felt by you. The good news is God is tender toward broken hearts and desires to heal every hurt.

Psalm 147 reminds us that God actively binds up our wounds. He sees the hurt and longs to bring restoration, whether emotional or spiritual. Sometimes healing requires us to bring these wounds to Him honestly and trust His timing.

Jesus' own suffering reminds us that we are not alone in brokenness. Leaning into God's healing power can renew your strength and help you move forward with hope and courage today and in your career.

2.	How have these wounds influenced your daily work life?
3.	What steps can you take to bring these hurts to God for healing?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write a letter to God describing your hidden wounds and asking for healing.
2.	Reflect on how Jesus' suffering gives meaning to your pain.
3.	List practical ways you can care for your emotional health at work.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Healer, You know the wounds hidden deep in my heart from offenses at work. I ask You to bind these hurts with Your loving touch and restore my spirit. Proverbs 15:1 – "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 3:17 "...the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere."
- Matthew 5:9 "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."







Devotional: Responding with Godly Wisdom and Grace

Conflict is inevitable in most workplaces, but how we respond makes all the difference. Proverbs 15:1 reminds us that gentle words can defuse anger and promote peace. God's wisdom enables us to be peacemakers with empathy, mercy, and sincerity.

James highlights qualities of godly wisdom that help us navigate professional relationships without offense. Choosing patience and understanding over harsh reactions reflects Christ's character and honors God.

When you face difficult encounters, pray for wisdom to respond calmly and graciously. Being a peacemaker not only protects your heart but also opens doors for reconciliation and trust in the workplace.

Devotional: Choosing Freedom Over Bitterness

Letting go of offense is ultimately an act of freedom and trust in God's justice.

Rather than holding onto bitterness or seeking revenge, Luke calls us to forgive and release judgment. This is a powerful way to protect our souls from negativity and anxiety.

Romans advises us to leave room for God to handle judgment, reminding us that vengeance belongs to Him. By surrendering offenses to God, we open ourselves to peace that surpasses human understanding.

When you consciously choose to let go, you break chains that could otherwise hold you back professionally and spiritually. This freedom enables you to focus on your calling with a clear and peaceful heart.
