Introduction

The Gospels invite us into the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, revealing truths that transform how we live daily. Among His many parables and signs, *the Fig Tree Lesson* in **Matthew 24:32–35** stands out as a powerful call to awareness and readiness.

Jesus uses the fig tree as a vivid metaphor: just as one knows summer is near when the fig tree's branches become tender and its leaves sprout, likewise, believers are called to discern the signs of the times — the events pointing to His return. This teaching reminds us to live intentionally and expectantly, avoiding complacency and instead embracing a vibrant faith.

In this study, we'll explore the layers of meaning in Jesus' words, unpacking the call to discernment and the promise embedded in His assurance that Heaven and earth will pass away, but His words will never fail. We will learn how to recognize spiritual seasons, remain vigilant, and grow in hope as we anticipate Christ's coming with faith-filled hearts.

As we journey through these passages, allow yourself to be challenged and encouraged: to live each day with purpose, to watch for God's movement in the world, and to hold fast to the eternal truth of Jesus' promises. This is a study about awakening, expectation, and the joy found in a faith that looks confidently forward to the future God has prepared.

Devotional: Discernment: Watching for God's Signs

Jesus' analogy of the fig tree calls us to active spiritual discernment. Just as people observe nature to know the change of seasons is near, Jesus encourages us to watch the signs unfolding around us—and within our hearts. The fig tree's budding leaves symbolize something new and hopeful arriving, much like the promise of Christ's return.

Discernment requires attentiveness—seeing beyond the surface to understand God's timing and purpose. It challenges us to stay spiritually awake amidst a world filled with distractions and confusion. This teaching is both practical and prophetic, inviting every believer to cultivate sensitivity to God's movements.

Are we noticing the 'twigs getting tender' in our lives? This means being open to growth, change, and the unfolding of God's plan. It also means recognizing warnings and encouragements God sends through Scripture, circumstances, and community. When we learn this lesson well, we live expectantly, preparing our hearts and lives for what God will do next.

Devotional: Embracing Hope: Living in Expectation
