Day 1: ① Standing Firm in Trials

Your Verse

1 Peter 1:6-7 - "In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold...—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:2-3 "Consider it pure joy... whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."
- Romans 5:3-4 "We also glory in our sufferings... suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."







Day 1: ① Standing Firm in Trials

Devotional: Finding Joy and Purpose in Suffering

Trials and suffering are never easy, but 1 Peter encourages believers to see them through a different lens. Peter's words remind us that the challenges we face serve a divine purpose: they test and refine our faith. Just as gold is purified through fire, so our faith gains character and strength through adversity.

When we endure hardships with faith, our perseverance becomes a testimony to God's sustaining power. This refining process results not only in personal spiritual growth but also in glory to God when Christ returns.
