Devotional: Choosing Peace by Resolving Conflict Quickly

Keeping short accounts means dealing with conflict quickly before it hardens into resentment. Jesus teaches that reconciliation is so important it sometimes takes priority over our worship and offerings to God.

When we delay forgiveness or avoid resolving conflicts, bitterness can grow unnoticed in our hearts. This bitterness makes it harder to forgive later and damages relationships we value. Romans reminds us to do everything possible to live at peace, showing that forgiveness is an active choice, not passive tolerance.

Patience helps, but so does courage—the courage to admit wrongs, ask for forgiveness, or forgive someone else. It's hard to let go of hurt, but the glory comes in choosing peace over pride.

Today, consider any unresolved conflicts in your life. What steps can you take today to keep your accounts short and bring healing through reconciliation?
