Devotional: The Power of Listening to Love Well

One of the most overlooked ways to love our neighbors is simply to listen—to give them our full attention and empathy. In a busy world full of noise and distractions, truly hearing someone is a powerful demonstration of respect and care. The book of James challenges us to be quick to listen and slow to speak, highlighting that listening before responding is both wise and loving.

Listening includes more than hearing words; it means seeking to understand feelings, needs, and perspectives. When we listen well, we create space for healing and connection. It's a tangible way to say, "You matter to me."

Consider how your listening habits convey love. Are you present and patient, or do distractions steal your attention? Practicing this form of love grows our compassion and helps reveal the needs our neighbors carry beneath the surface.

Devotional: Humble Service as Love in Action

Devotional: The Freedom Found in Forgiveness

Holding onto bitterness only builds walls; forgiveness breaks them down, freeing both the giver and receiver. When we forgive, we invite God's grace to mend wounded hearts and renew trust.

Who in your life needs your forgiveness? Is there a burden you're carrying that God wants to help you release? Choosing forgiveness is choosing love's power to redeem even the most broken relationships.
