#### Devotional: Watching for Signs Without Fear

Jesus' Olivet Discourse reveals warning signs before the end. Wars, famines, earthquakes, persecution, and false messiahs are markers that we are living in the age of fulfillment. But Jesus cautions these signs don't equal immediate end; rather, they signal the beginning of birth pains—preparing for something new from God.

How do we respond in such uncertain times? Jesus says to watch, meaning to stay spiritually alert, grounded in Scripture, and discerning. These signs aren't meant to frighten but to motivate watchfulness and dependence on God. They underscore the value of perseverance in faith.

As we recognize these signs unfolding globally and spiritually, may we be people marked by vigilance, hope, and love, faithfully waiting for our Lord's return.

#### Devotional: Spiritual Readiness Through the Parables

Jesus uses parables to teach spiritual preparedness. The Ten Virgins parable emphasizes the importance of being ready with oil—symbolizing spiritual readiness—when the bridegroom arrives. The wise are prepared, while the foolish neglect the preparation and miss the celebration.

Readiness involves more than awareness; it calls for active, sustained faith. In Luke, Jesus urges us to keep our lamps burning, staying alert through prayer, holiness, and ethical living. Waiting isn't passive but diligent and expectant.

These parables convict us to examine our lives: Are we storing spiritual oil daily? Are we cultivating intimacy with Christ, allowing His light to shine through us? Are we ready to step in faith at a moment's notice? Living prepared means living with intention, trusting God's timing, and maintaining hope.

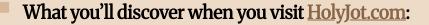




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
