Devotional: Embracing God's Call to Holiness

Holiness is more than a standard; it's a calling. Devotional: Equipped to Stand Strong

Devotional: Living in Alert Expectation

Jesus calls us to be watchful and prayerful. His return is certain but the timing unknown. *Mark 13:33* echoes a warning to stay alert, to be prepared spiritually and mentally for the last days.

Watchfulness goes beyond simply noticing events around us. It means living actively in faith—praying consistently, discerning God's voice, and cultivating a heart that longs for Christ's coming. Prayer fuels our spiritual readiness and strengthens us against complacency.

Devotional: Connected to the Source of Life
