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#### Introduction

**The Gospels** are the heart of the New Testament, revealing Jesus' life, teachings, death, and resurrection. They invite us into a journey of faith marked by hope and constant readiness. *In Luke 12:36—38, Jesus challenges His followers to live as servants awaiting their master's return, ready to open the door at any moment.* This message echoes through the four accounts of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, emphasizing vigilant trust and joyful anticipation.

Living with the mindset that Jesus could return tonight changes everything. It shapes how we value time, prioritize relationships, and engage in service. It calls us to a faith that is not passive but active and watchful—ready to respond and rejoice. This study plan invites you to reflect deeply on what it means to live daily in expectancy, drawing lessons from Jesus' parables and examples found in the Gospels.

#### During these three days, we will:

- Discover the attitude and actions of the servants waiting faithfully.
- Understand the importance of watchfulness and preparedness in our spiritual walk.
- Embrace the hope and urgency that Jesus' return brings to our everyday lives.

#### Your Verse

Luke 12:36–38 NIV – "be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet... Blessed are those servants."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Matthew 24:44 "You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him."
- Mark 13:33 "Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come."







#### Devotional: Faithful Waiting with Lamps Aflame

**Luke 12:36–38** portrays the servants poised and alert, ready to welcome the master home at any moment. Their preparedness is marked by a constant readiness that doesn't grow weary—it is alive and active, symbolized through keeping their lamps burning. This image powerfully reminds us that Christian life is not about casual faith but about intentional vigilance.

Jesus' call to be 'dressed ready for service' invites us into a posture of expectancy. Just as the servants would open immediately when the master knocked, we are to be spiritually alert, not distracted by worldly cares or complacency. This readiness stems from love and devotion, driven by the hope and joyful anticipation of Jesus' return.

Prayerfully consider what it means to keep your lamp burning. How does your lifestyle reflect a heart prepared for sudden encounter? The urgency in Jesus' teaching is not meant to create fear but to encourage faithfulness, empowering us to live with purpose and passion every day.

#### Devotional: The Power of a Watchful Heart

The Parable of the Ten Virgins in **Matthew 25:1-13** complements Jesus' teaching in Luke by emphasizing the necessity of ongoing watchfulness. Five virgins prepared well with oil, while five lacked foresight and were left outside the wedding feast. This story powerfully reveals that readiness requires action—active, consistent preparation.

Watchfulness is not passive waiting but a dynamic engagement with faith. It involves prayer, spiritual disciplines, and choices that keep us aligned with God's will. The urgency is real since the timing of Jesus' return remains unknown. But the promise of blessing rests on those who remain alert and persevering.

Ask yourself today, how is your watchfulness reflected in your daily routines and relationships? Are you nurturing your spirit, praying, and seeking God's guidance? This is the life that honors the Master — a life of intentional preparation that fills us with hope and peace.
