Devotional: Joy in Simplicity: Finding Contentment in God

Devotional: Faithful Waiting: Trusting God's Perfect Timing

It is natural to wrestle with impatience or uncertainty during singleness, especially when it feels like life's milestones are delayed. Yet Scripture consistently reminds us that God's timing is perfect.

Ecclesiastes teaches that every season has its purpose. Trusting God means surrendering control and believing His plans are for our good, not harm. Proverbs tells us to lean not on our own understanding but to acknowledge God in all our ways.

Trust is not passive waiting but active faith. It's engaging in the present with hope and confidence, knowing that God is preparing you for what is ahead. Allow this season to develop your patience, faith, and character.

Devotional: Rooted in Christ: Living Your True Purpose

Paul declares in Galatians that his life is now Christ's life, inviting us to see beyond our circumstances to the new creation we are in Him. Ephesians reminds us that God created each of us intentionally for good works, preparing us to walk in purpose.

Celebrate who you are in Christ—chosen, loved, and empowered to live fully. Let this be a season where you grow in your relationship with God and express your unique calling with confidence and joy.
