# Day 1: Francisco Turning Back









Day 1: 💞 The Call to Follow Without Turning Back

#### Your Verse

Luke 9:62 – Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Matthew 16:24 Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me."
- Philippians 3:13–14 Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead.







Day 1: 💗 The Call to Follow Without Turning Back

#### Devotional: Eyes Forward: The Cost of Discipleship

Jesus' words in Luke 9:62 serve as a sobering reminder of the level of commitment required to follow Him. The image of a plowman who must keep his eyes fixed straight ahead illustrates the necessity of undivided attention and determination. In agriculture, glancing backward means crooked furrows and wasted effort—similarly, a divided heart leads to a compromised discipleship.

Jesus invites us to a radical lifestyle, where self-denial is not merely a suggestion but a prerequisite for participation in God's kingdom. *Taking up the cross* involves embracing sacrifice and prioritizing Jesus over personal comfort, relationships, and past identity.

Paul's words in Philippians reinforce this with a practical approach: to move forward, we must intentionally forget what lies behind us—past mistakes, regrets, or even former achievements—and set our hearts toward the prize of the heavenly call. This means we cannot dwell on previous failures or be distracted by worldly concerns without risking becoming ineffective in God's service.

Today challenges us to examine where we might still be looking back—whether to fear, sin, or familiar habits—and invites us to refocus on Christ with fresh resolve.

## Devotional: Faith In Motion: The Active Path of Following

When Jesus called His first disciples in Mark 1:17, He offered a simple but profound invitation: "Follow me." This call was not abstract or passive; it entailed leaving behind their fishing nets—their livelihoods—and trusting Jesus to lead them to a new purpose. Following Jesus is an active, ongoing choice grounded in faith.

In John 10:27, Jesus identifies close followers as sheep who recognize and respond to His voice, signifying intimacy and attentiveness. This relationship requires not only hearing but obedience and responsiveness to His guidance. It's more than belief; it is a daily, lived-out commitment demonstrated in action.

Luke 14:27 illustrates the price of this faith. Carrying one's cross means accepting trials, sacrifices, and sometimes incomprehensible hardship—all out of love and allegiance to Christ. The focus shifts from comfort to a willingness to endure difficulty for a higher, eternal purpose.

To follow Jesus is to be fishers of people, to live as His hands and feet in the world. It challenges us to engage boldly in God's mission, trusting that His call transforms our lives and the lives around us.

Day 3: 6 Committed to the Kingdom Life

### Devotional: Pursuing God's Kingdom Without Hesitation

Jesus' teaching in Matthew 6:33 points believers toward a life fully devoted to God's kingdom. Seeking first His kingdom means prioritizing God's reign, righteousness, and purpose above all else. When this is central, other needs and anxieties fall into their proper place.

Paul, in Romans, calls us to offer our very bodies as living sacrifices—holy and pleasing to God. This spiritual act of worship involves total surrender, aligning every aspect of our lives to His will. It's a daily commitment that reflects back on the plowman metaphor: ready, steady, uncompromising dedication.

Hebrews encourages us to run with perseverance, reminding us that the Christian journey is a race requiring endurance, focus, and steadfast faith. Distractions and setbacks are inevitable, but we are called to keep our gaze fixed on the finish line—the prize of eternal life with Christ.

This final day challenges us to evaluate our personal commitment level and renew our determination to live the Gospel fully. Let us embrace the Kingdom life with passion and integrity, continually motivated by God's mercy and grace.
