Devotional: God's Nearness in Our Brokenness

Day 2: 7 Growth Through Grief

Devotional: Purposeful Growth Amid Pain

Grief leaves us amidst ruins, yet God's Word teaches us that even in hardship, He is working for our good. **Romans 8:28** assures believers that nothing is wasted when it is surrendered to God's plan.

Devotional: Hope Strengthened Through Suffering

Grief can feel like an unbearable fire consuming our joy, but Scripture reveals this refining process is essential for strengthening our faith. Peter assures us that trials test our faith's genuineness, much like gold is purified by fire.

This period of grief, though painful, is shaping a robust hope within you. The process builds perseverance and character, culminating in a resilient hope that anchors your soul. Romans 5 helps us see suffering as a necessary step toward hope that does not disappoint.

Additionally, the psalmist comforts us that God is actively healing and restoring the brokenhearted even now. Your hope is not in vain; it is being refined and made powerful through God's loving hands.

Devotional: Embracing God's New Work
