Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Supporting Scriptures

- Lamentations 3:22–23 'Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.'
- Ephesians 2:8 'For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God.'







Devotional: Starting Fresh with God's Sufficient Grace

Starting fresh begins with embracing the grace God offers us every day.

Often, regret weighs us down because we forget that God's grace is not limited by our past mistakes or missed opportunities. Paul's words to the Corinthians remind us that God's power shines brightest in our weakness. When we acknowledge our shortcomings instead of running from them, we allow God's grace to transform our lives.

God's mercies are new every morning (Lamentations 3:22–23). That means every day holds the possibility for a new beginning. Even if you feel overwhelmed by regret over missed chances, God invites you to start again today, trusting that His grace is sufficient.

How might your view of past failures change if you truly believe God's grace is enough to cover them all? Embrace the truth that salvation and daily life sustained by grace are gifts, not earned through perfect performance but received through faith (Ephesians 2:8). Today, stand firm in God's grace and let it be your foundation for living without regret.

Devotional: God Restores Lost Years and Redeems Life

Many men carry the heavy burden of lost time and missed chances, but God declares that He can restore all that is lost. The prophet Joel speaks a powerful word of hope: God will restore the years taken from us by setbacks and failures. This reminds us that our past does not have to define our future.

Psalm 103 tells us God redeems our lives from the depths of despair. Redemption means God takes what seems wasted or broken and transforms it into something valuable and new. We must let go of the past and trust God to do a new work in our hearts and circumstances (Isaiah 43:18-19).

What missed opportunities are you holding onto? Can you surrender them to God and allow Him to redeem those moments? When we release our grip on regret, we make room for God's restorative power to move in and bring healing and hope.

- Romans 8:1 'Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.'







Day 3: The Power of Second Chances

Devotional: God's Forgiveness Opens Doors for Second Chances

The story of the prodigal son captures the heart of God's mercy and His desire to give us second chances. Like many men, the prodigal son made choices that led him away from his father. Yet, when he returned in repentance, his father received him with open arms, full of love and compassion.

This story reminds us that no matter how far we've strayed or how unworthy we may feel, God eagerly waits to welcome us back. Romans 8:1 assures us there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ. Our past does not disqualify us from God's forgiveness and new beginnings.

How does knowing God offers you a second chance change the way you view your failures and regrets? Today, embrace the freedom that comes from repentance and the joy of being fully accepted by your Heavenly Father.

- 2 Corinthians 4:8–9 'We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair.'







Devotional: God Draws Near to Heal Broken Hearts

Brokenness and regret can feel isolating, but God draws near to those who are hurting. Psalm 34:18 assures us that God is close to the brokenhearted and rescues those crushed in spirit. Our deepest wounds and mistakes can become a platform for God's glory.

In John 9, Jesus explained that suffering and brokenness sometimes serve a greater purpose: to reveal God's power and goodness. Paul's words to the Corinthians similarly remind us that difficulties do not defeat us—they refine us.

How might your brokenness and regrets be used by God to display His glory and grace? God's redemption often flows through our vulnerabilities, giving us strength to live purposefully despite our past.

Romans 15:13 – "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 6:19 'We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure.'
- Jeremiah 29:11 'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'







Devotional: Fixing Your Soul's Anchor on God's Hope

Hope is the anchor that keeps us steady when regret tries to pull us under. God's own hope fills us with joy and peace, helping us trust Him beyond our circumstances. Paul's prayer in Romans encourages us to trust deeply so that hope floods our hearts and lives.

Hebrews reminds us this hope is firm and secure, holding fast our souls amid storms. When regret and doubt threaten stability, fix your eyes on God's promises, especially His good plans for your future (Jeremiah 29:11).

How does anchoring your life in hope transform how you view missed opportunities? Let today be a day to renew your confidence in God's unfailing purpose for your life.

- Proverbs 3:5-6 'Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.'







Devotional: Pressing Forward, Leaving Regret Behind

Living without regret means refusing to be held hostage by the past and pressing forward toward God's calling. Paul models this by intentionally forgetting what is behind and striving toward what lies ahead. He challenges us to focus on the prize—our eternal hope—rather than past mistakes.

Isaiah reminds us that hope in the LORD renews strength and empowers us to rise above challenges. When we trust God's wisdom and submit our paths to Him (Proverbs 3:5-6), we gain clarity and courage to move boldly.

Are you willing to release past regrets and strain forward toward God's purpose for your life? Today, choose boldness in faith as you walk the path God has set before you.

Day 7: 6 Living a Life Without Regret

Devotional: Choosing Wisdom to Live Fully Without Regret

Living without regret is not about forgetting the past, but about valuing each day as a divine gift. Psalm 90:12 urges us to number our days wisely, gaining wisdom that shapes our living. When we recognize life's brevity and purpose, we align ourselves with God's eternal perspective.

Ecclesiastes reminds us that life has seasons—accepting this truth frees us from unrealistic expectations or lingering regrets. Instead, we commit to wholehearted living, serving God in every moment (Colossians 3:23–24).

How can you cultivate a heart of wisdom that chooses to live fully and without regret every day? Let this be your guiding commitment: to steward your time, choices, and relationships with intention and grace.
